Designating a certain bridge crossing the Lehigh River in Bethlehem, Northampton County, as the Philip J. Fahy Memorial Bridge.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The new bridge crossing the Lehigh River in Bethlehem, Northampton County, presently known as the New Street Bridge and connecting the north side of Bethlehem to the south side is hereby officially designated and shall be known as the "Philip J. Fahy Memorial Bridge."

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

The foregoing is a true and correct copy of Act of the General Assembly No. 179.
