Amending the act of August 9, 1955 (P.L.323), entitled "An act relating to counties of the third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth classes; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," providing for the appointment of an assistant county solicitor in counties of the fifth and sixth classes.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 904, act of August 9, 1955 (P.L.323), known as "The County Code," amended June 19, 1968 (P.L.226), is amended to read:

Section 904. Assistant Solicitors in Third, [and] Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Class Counties.—In counties of the third class, the county commissioners may appoint not more than three assistant county solicitors, and, with the approval of the court of common pleas, special counsel who shall be attorneys at law admitted to practice in the courts of this Commonwealth. In counties of the fourth, [class] fifth and sixth classes, the county commissioners may appoint an assistant solicitor who shall be an attorney at law admitted to practice in the courts of this Commonwealth. Each assistant and special counsel shall perform such duties in connection with the legal affairs of the county as may be assigned to him by the county commissioners or the county solicitor.
