AN ACT

HB 1754

Making appropriations for emergency and disaster relief in connection with flooding and tropical storm disaster in the Commonwealth.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of one hundred thirteen million dollars (\$113,000,000), or as much thereof as is necessary is hereby appropriated to the Governor for emergency and disaster relief especially in connection with the tropical storm and flood damage of June, 1972; for emergency use in the alleviation of human hardship and suffering and for the protection of property; for the reimbursement to various departments and agencies of the Commonwealth for their participation in disaster relief activities, including, but not limited to, materials, supplies, services, food, clothing, equipment, chemicals, drugs and medicines; channel enlargement, rectification, realignment and side slope protection; and transportation, and for the payment of bills incurred in connection with the above purposes in the fiscal year ended June 30, 1972.

Section 2. The sum of twenty-five million dollars (\$25,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary is hereby appropriated to the Governor for use under his direction by the Department of Public Welfare for assistance payments and county administration of the public assistance programs and medical assistance in connection with the flood and tropical storm disaster of June, 1972.

Section 3. The Department of Public Welfare shall allocate funds from time to time from the assistance appropriation for administrative expenses of the several county boards of assistance, for such administrative expenses incurred by the department which are chargeable to such boards and for the payment of attorney's fees and court costs necessary for the proper conduct of the public assistance programs and for the several assistance programs including medical assistance.

Section 4. The sum of ten million dollars (\$10,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary is hereby appropriated to the Governor for use under his direction by the Department of Health for any and all health services in connection with the flood and tropical storm disaster of June, 1972.

Section 5. The sum of two million dollars (\$2,000,000), or as much as may be necessary is hereby appropriated to the Governor for use under his direction by the Department of Environmental Resources for general government operations in connection with the aforementioned tropical storm and flood damage of June, 1972.

Section 6. In addition to the amounts appropriated herein, all moneys

received from the Federal Government, or from any other source as contributions for the program, shall be paid into the General Fund and credited to the respective appropriations in the various departments.

Section 7. This act shall take effect immediately.

A SUPPLEMENT

HB 2276

To the act of July 7, 1972 (Act No. 17-A), entitled "An act to provide for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 1972 to June 30, 1973, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1972," itemizing appropriations required from the Motor License Fund for the proper operations of the several departments of the Commonwealth authorized to spend Motor License Fund moneys.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. This supplement shall be known and may be cited as the "Motor License Fund Supplement to the General Appropriation Act of 1972."

Section 2. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or appointed officers and employes of the Commonwealth, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1972 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1972.

To the Department of Transportation

For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the proper administration of the Department of Transportation, including planning and research, engineering, right-of-way, highway construction, special construction, maintenance, service functions and transportation safety

In addition to this amount, all moneys received from the Federal Government or from any other source as contributions to or payments for this program shall be paid into the Motor License Fund and credited to this appropriation.

For payment from the restricted revenue accounts for aviation fuel taxes and airport operations revenue, for aviation operations including the payment of general expenses, supplies, printing and equipment; for the development and maintenance of State airports and the

maintenance and repair of landing fields, intermediate landing fields, landing field equipment, beacon sites, other navigation facilities, and the encouragement and development of civil aeronautics 3,650,000

In addition to this amount, all moneys received from the Federal Government or from any other source as contributions to or payments for this program shall be paid into the Motor License Fund and credited to this appropriation.

For payment of interest and principal on State Highway and Bridge Authority bonds issued for highway purposes..... 38,100,000

For payments to municipalities to assist in maintenance and construction costs of roads in accordance with the act of June 1, 1956 (P.L.1944) relative to the allocation of highway fines 79,000,000

For payment from the restricted revenue account for aviation fuel taxes for airport construction and development including encouragement and development of aeronautics, development of State airports, assistance to political subdivisions and municipal authorities in the construction and improvement of airports and other aeronautical facilities..... 3,000,000

No more shall be expended from this item for such purpose or any of them than may be required to match an equal sum contributed by any political subdivision, or municipality authority of the Commonwealth or by the Federal Government, or by a political subdivision or municipality authority and the Federal Government as provided in the act of May 2, 1947 (P.L.136), relating to Federal aid for airports.

In addition to the amounts appropriated by this act, all moneys received from the Federal Government or from any other source as contributions to or payments for the programs provided herein shall be paid into the Motor License Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the Motor License Fund for the purposes and programs intended.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 1972.

HB 2285

Making appropriations to the Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency to provide scholarships and educational assistance grants, to provide funds for lender participation incentives, to provide funds for the purpose of assisting approved institutions of higher learning in securing Federal funds for financial aid to students, and to administer the agency and otherwise carry out the provisions of the act of August 7, 1963 (P.L.549), and the act of January 25, 1966 (P.L.1546).

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums are hereby specifically appropriated to the Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency for the fiscal year July 1, 1972 to June 30, 1973, to be transferred and deposited in the Higher Education Assistance Funds for the following uses and purposes:

- (1) For payment of scholarships and education assistance grants under the provisions of the act of January 25, 1966 (P.L.1546) \$60,458,000
- (2) For the purpose of administering the programs of the agency authorized under the act of August 7, 1963 (P.L.549), and the act of January 25, 1966 (P.L.1546), including payment of lender participation incentives 2,650,000
- (3) For the purpose of assisting approved institutions of higher learning in securing and obtaining maximum participation in Federal student aid funds to be used as financial aid to students in meeting their costs of attendance at such institutions under the provisions of the act of January 25, 1966 (P.L.1546) 2,000,000
- (4) For the purpose of being held in reserve to guarantee loans granted for payment of possible losses of such loans granted and for the payment of lender participation incentives 1,600,000

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1972.

Making an appropriation to the Department of Community Affairs for housing and redevelopment assistance.

The sum of nineteen million five hundred thousand dollars (\$19,500,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Community Affairs to be expended by making grants for housing and redevelopment assistance as authorized by the act of May 20, 1949 (P.L.1633), known as the "Housing and Redevelopment Assistance Law," and by payment of the costs of administering such act up to but not exceeding an amount equalling two per cent of this appropriation. No more than twenty per cent of the amount herein appropriated shall be allocated or granted to any one political subdivision.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1972.

HB 2587

Appropriating Federal money made available under section 903 of the Federal Social Security Act for use by the Bureau of Employment Security of the Department of Labor and Industry for the administration of the Unemployment Compensation Law and public employment offices.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated out of funds made available to this Commonwealth under section 903 of the Federal Social Security Act, as amended, the sum of ten million seven hundred eight thousand six hundred thirty-nine dollars seventy-three cents (\$10,708,639.73), or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be used, under the direction of the Bureau of Employment Security of the Department of Labor and Industry, for the payment of expenses incurred in performing services in connection with the administration of the act of December 5, 1936 (1937 P.L.2897), as amended, known as the "Unemployment Compensation Law," and of the State's public employment offices, for fiscal years 1973 and 1974, for which the Federal Government does not, in the opinion of the Department of Labor and Industry, provide sufficient funds.

An amount not to exceed two million eight hundred thousand dollars (\$2,800,000) shall be allocated for the taking and processing of unemployment compensation claims, for the making of monetary and nonmonetary determinations, for the hearing and deciding of appeals, and related activities for fiscal year 1973; and an amount not to exceed two million five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000) shall be allocated for payment of salary increases, life and health insurance coverages, and travel expenses for employment security personnel provided for in union negotiated contracts for fiscal year 1973; and an amount not to exceed five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) for payment of unemployment compensation to separated bureau employes for fiscal year 1973.

The balance of this appropriation, four million nine hundred eight thousand six hundred thirty-nine dollars seventy-three cents (\$4,908,639.73) shall be allocated to defray the cost of employment services such as placement, counseling, testing, labor market information, service to veterans, the handicapped, minority groups, older workers, youth, women and other related employment service functions for fiscal year 1973.

Any portion of this appropriation of \$10,708,639.73 not used for fiscal year 1973 may be used for the (aforestated) purposes specified in the two immediately preceding paragraphs in fiscal year 1974.

Section 2. No part of the money hereby appropriated may be

obligated after the expiration of the two-year period beginning on the date of enactment of this act.

Section 3. The amount obligated pursuant to this act during any twelve-month period beginning on July 1 and ending on the next June 30 shall not exceed the amount by which: (1) the aggregate of the amounts credited to the account of this State pursuant to section 903 of the Social Security Act during such twelve-month period and the twenty-four preceding twelve-month periods exceeds (2) the aggregate of the amounts obligated for administration and paid out for benefits and charged against the amounts credited to the account of this State during such twenty-five twelve-month periods.

Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of Temple University at Philadelphia for the fiscal year July 1, 1972 to June 30, 1973, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For net cost of instruction excluding Doctor of Medicine	\$43,124,000
(2) For net cost of student aid.....	1,700,000
(3) For net cost of extension and public services	50,000
(4) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only	4,837,000

Section 2. Payments to Temple University on account of the appropriations for all items, as provided in section 1 of this act, except for instruction - Doctor of Medicine, shall be made on the basis of net costs during the fiscal year.

Payments for instruction - Doctor of Medicine only shall be made on the basis of full-time equivalent students enrolled at the rate of seven thousand four hundred sixty-five dollars (\$7,465) per student.

Section 3. If necessary, Temple University may transfer funds among the appropriations listed in section 1, clauses (1), (2) and (3): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed ten per cent of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.

Section 4. Payments to Temple University of the appropriations herein provided shall be made quarterly during the fiscal year as follows:

- (1) First payment on September 30, 1972.
- (2) Second payment on December 31, 1972.
- (3) Third payment on March 31, 1973.
- (4) Fourth payment on June 30, 1973.

Such quarterly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of sections 2 and 3 of this act, on the basis of estimated net costs and full-time equivalent students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program except that in the case of noncompliance with the requirements of section 6 the third and fourth quarterly payments shall be withheld. The estimate of net costs shall be submitted by Temple University to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and to the State Treasurer not later than thirty days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 5. Temple University shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than one hundred twenty days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, Temple University shall file with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year the number of full-time equivalent students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and net costs, as provided in section 2 of this act, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year. Such statement of expenditures, and number of full-time equivalent students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and net costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by Temple University to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. The Auditor General shall also make a determination of full-time equivalent students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and net costs and make certification as to their correctness. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning said expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 6. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives prior to March 31, 1973 which shall include for all programs of the university except the Doctor of Medicine program the following:

(1) For those terms of 1972-1973 which have been completed and estimates for the remaining terms of 1972-1973:

(i) The definitions and numbers of full-time faculty members, of part-time faculty members, of full-time students enrolled in graduate

courses, of full-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses, of part-time students enrolled in graduate courses, and of part-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses;

(ii) Total numbers of undergraduate student credits and of graduate student credits;

(iii) Number of different courses scheduled, distributed by the number of sections scheduled in each course and the sections distributed by the number of students enrolled in each section;

(iv) Number of terms scheduled in the fiscal year and the dates thereof;

(v) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureate degree, and for a master's degree;

(vi) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, and doctoral degrees awarded in 1970, 1971, 1972 and estimated 1973.

(2) For those terms of 1972-1973 which have been completed and estimates for the remaining terms of 1972-1973 a classification of faculty members by full-time, part-time; and by assignments in undergraduate courses only, graduate courses only, both graduate and undergraduate courses; and by title such as professor, associate professor, assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, research associate, and the following aggregates for each classification:

(i) The number in each classification;

(ii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate courses taught by all faculty members in each classification;

(iii) The sum of credits assigned to graduate courses taught by all faculty members in each classification;

(iv) The sum of undergraduate student credits and the sum of graduate student credits taught by all faculty members in each classification;

(v) Total salary paid to all faculty members in each classification;

(vi) Total salary paid from Federal funds to all faculty members in each classification.

(3) For each term of the fiscal year 1972-1973 an analysis of the average weekly work load of each full-time faculty member, identified by school, department and title.

(4) Recommendations of a formula to be applied in the determination of annual appropriations to be made to the university. The formula shall reflect such factors as faculty productivity, the number of full-time equivalent students, and average class size and shall be directed toward providing financial incentives to maintain an average faculty teaching assignment equivalent to twelve credits per semester or twenty-four credits per year if the number of credits required for a baccalaureate degree is one hundred twenty or adjusted proportionately if the baccalaureate degree requirements differ from one hundred twenty. The

report shall include all definitions and facts utilized in determining the recommended formula.

Section 7. The university shall file on or before April 1, 1973 with the appropriation committees of the General Assembly and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth in such detail and form as prescribed by the respective appropriation committees of the General Assembly and the Auditor General:

(1) A statement listing all research projects undertaken with State funds provided for from moneys appropriated by this act. Each designated research project shall be accounted for separately.

(2) Semi-annual progress reports on all projects involving State funds appropriated under the provisions of this act.

(3) A listing of all contracts with the Commonwealth, and the status thereof, as part of their annual fiscal report.

Section 8. The university shall report its expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in "College and University Business Administration" of the American Council on Education, Revised Edition, 1968.

Section 9. This act shall take effect immediately.

Section 2. Payments to the University of Pittsburgh on account of the appropriations for all items, as provided in section 1 of this act except for instruction - Doctor of Medicine shall be made on the basis of net costs during the fiscal year.

Payments for instruction - Doctor of Medicine shall be made on the basis of full-time equivalent student enrollment at the rate of seven thousand four hundred sixty-five dollars (\$7,465) per student.

Section 3. If necessary the University of Pittsburgh may transfer funds between the appropriations listed in section 1, clauses (1) and (2): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed ten percent (10%) of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.

Section 4. Payments to the University of Pittsburgh of the appropriations herein provided shall be made quarterly during the fiscal year as follows:

The formula shall reflect such factors as faculty productivity, the number of full-time equivalent students, and average class size and shall be directed toward providing financial incentives to maintain an average faculty teaching assignment equivalent to twelve credits per semester or twenty-four credits per year if the number of credits required for a baccalaureate degree is one hundred twenty or adjusted proportionately if the baccalaureate degree requirements differ from one hundred twenty. The report shall include all definitions and facts utilized in determining the recommended formula.

Section 7. The university shall file on or before April 1, 1973 with the appropriation committees of the General Assembly and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth in such detail and form as prescribed by the respective appropriation committees of the General Assembly and the Auditor General:

(1) A statement listing all research projects undertaken with State funds provided for from moneys appropriated by this act. Each designated research project shall be accounted for separately.

(2) Semi-annual progress reports on all projects involving State funds appropriated under the provisions of this act.

(3) A listing of all contracts with the Commonwealth, and the status thereof, as part of their annual fiscal report.

Section 8. The university shall report its expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in "College and University Business Administration" of the American Council on Education, Revised Edition 1968.

Section 9. This act shall take effect immediately.

A SUPPLEMENT

HB 2321

To the act of April 1, 1863 (P.L.213), entitled "An act to accept the grant of Public Lands, by the United States, to the several states, for the endowment of Agricultural Colleges," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect, providing for a basis for payments of such appropriations, providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated and providing for a comprehensive study and report.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. In order to carry into effect the act of Congress, approved July 2, 1862, granting public land to the several states for educational purposes, and subsequent acts of Congress related thereto, and the act of the General Assembly of Pennsylvania accepting the provisions and conditions of said acts of Congress and pledging the faith of the State to carry the same into effect, the following sums or as much thereof as may be necessary are hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the Pennsylvania State University for the fiscal year July 1, 1972 to June 30, 1973, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For net cost of instruction excluding Doctor of Medicine	\$56,514,000
(2) For net cost of student aid.....	1,672,000
(3) For net cost of extension and public services	8,468,000
(4) For net cost of sponsored research.....	2,066,000
(5) For net cost of other research.....	12,945,000
(6) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only	2,090,000

Section 2. Payments to Pennsylvania State University on account of the appropriations for all items as provided in section 1 of this act except for instruction - Doctor of Medicine shall be made on the basis of net costs during the fiscal year.

Payments for instruction - Doctor of Medicine shall be made on the basis of full-time equivalent students enrollment at the rate of seven thousand four hundred sixty-five dollars (\$7,465) per student.

Section 3. If necessary, the Pennsylvania State University may transfer funds among the appropriations listed in section 1, clauses (1), (2), (3), (4) and (5): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed ten per cent (10%) of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.

Section 4. Payments to the Pennsylvania State University of the appropriations herein provided shall be made quarterly during the fiscal year as follows:

- (1) First payment on September 30, 1972.
- (2) Second payment on December 31, 1972.

(3) Third payment on March 31, 1973.

(4) Fourth payment on June 30, 1973.

Such quarterly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of sections 2 and 3 of this act, on the basis of estimated net costs and full-time equivalent students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program except that in the case of noncompliance with the requirements of section 6 the third and fourth quarterly payments shall be withheld. The estimate of net costs shall be submitted by the Pennsylvania State University to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and to the State Treasurer not later than thirty days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 5. The Pennsylvania State University shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than one hundred twenty days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, the Pennsylvania State University shall file with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly, and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year, the number of full-time equivalent students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and net costs, as provided in sections 2 and 3 of this act, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.

Such statement of expenditures and number of full-time equivalent students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and net costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by the Pennsylvania State University to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. The Auditor General shall also make a determination of full-time equivalent students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and net costs and make a certification as to their correctness. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning such expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 6. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives prior to March 31, 1973 which shall include for all programs of the university except the Doctor of Medicine program the following:

(1) For those terms of 1972-1973 which have been completed and estimates for the remaining terms of 1972-1973:

(i) The definitions and numbers of full-time faculty members, of

part-time faculty members, of full-time students enrolled in graduate courses, of full-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses, of part-time students enrolled in graduate courses, and of part-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses;

(ii) Total numbers of undergraduate student credits and of graduate student credits;

(iii) Number of different courses scheduled, distributed by the number of sections scheduled in each course and the sections distributed by the number of students enrolled in each section;

(iv) Number of terms scheduled in the fiscal year and the dates thereof;

(v) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureate degree, and for a master's degree;

(vi) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, and doctoral degrees awarded in 1970, 1971, 1972 and estimated 1973.

(2) For those terms of 1972-1973 which have been completed and estimates for the remaining terms of 1972-1973 a classification of faculty members by full-time, part-time; and by assignments in undergraduate courses only, graduate courses only, both graduate and undergraduate courses; and by title such as professor, associate professor, assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, research associate, and the following aggregates for each classification:

(i) The number in each classification;

(ii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate courses taught by all faculty members in each classification;

(iii) The sum of credits assigned to graduate courses taught by all faculty members in each classification;

(iv) The sum of undergraduate student credits and the sum of graduate student credits taught by all faculty members in each classification;

(v) Total salary paid to all faculty members in each classification;

(vi) Total salary paid from Federal funds to all faculty members in each classification.

(3) For each term of the fiscal year 1972-1973 an analysis of the average weekly work load of each full-time faculty member, identified by school, department and title.

(4) Recommendations of a formula to be applied in the determination of annual appropriations to be made to the university. The formula shall reflect such factors as faculty productivity, the number of full-time equivalent students, and average class size and shall be directed toward providing financial incentives to maintain an average faculty teaching assignment equivalent to twelve credits per semester or twenty-four credits per year if the number of credits required for a baccalaureate degree is one hundred twenty or adjusted proportionately if the baccalaureate degree requirements differ from one hundred twenty. The

report shall include all definitions and facts utilized in determining the recommended formula.

Section 7. The university shall file on or before April 1, 1973 with the appropriation committees of the General Assembly and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth in such detail and form as prescribed by the respective appropriation committees of the General Assembly and the Auditor General:
