Amending the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103, No.69), entitled "An act concerning townships of the second class; and amending, revising, consolidating, and changing the law relating thereto," further providing for the compensation of the township manager.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 599.1, act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103, No.69), known as "The Second Class Township Code," reenacted and amended July 10, 1947 (P.L.1481, No.567), and added May 20, 1949 (P.L.1562, No.474), is amended to read:

Section 599.1. Appointment, Removal, Powers and Duties; Compensation; Bond.—The supervisors may by ordinance, at any time, create the office of township manager and may, in like manner, abolish the same. While said office exists the supervisors shall, from time to time, and, whenever there is a vacancy, by majority vote, elect one person to fill said office, who shall serve until his successor is elected and qualified. Any such township manager shall be subject to removal by the supervisors by majority vote.

The powers and duties [and the compensation] of the township manager shall be fixed by ordinance. The compensation shall be set by resolution and paid out of the general fund of the township. The supervisors may delegate, subject to recall, any of their non-legislative powers and duties to the township manager. He shall give bond to the township, with sufficient surety, to be approved by the supervisors, in such sum as they shall by ordinance direct, conditioned for the faithful performance of his duties.

The office of township manager shall not be deemed incompatible with the office of township secretary, township treasurer, or any other township office or employment, except that of supervisor.
