## AN ACT

HB 1167

Amending the act of May 31, 1945 (P.L.1198, No.418), entitled, as amended, "An act providing for the conservation and improvement of land affected in connection with surface mining; regulating such mining; and providing penalties," eliminating insurance and bond requirements in certain cases.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 4, act of May 31, 1945 (P.L.1198, No.418), known as the "Surface Mining Conservation and Reclamation Act," is amended by adding a subsection to read:

Section 4.

Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause J. of clause (2) of subsection (a) and subsections (c) and (d) of this section, in the case of applications for the surface mining of minerals other than anthracite and bituminous coal where the department determines that the amount of marketable minerals to be extracted does not exceed two thousand (2,000) tons, no certificate of insurance nor bond shall be required.
