AN ACT

HB 194

Amending the act of July 7, 1972 (No.17-A), entitled "An act to provide for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 1972 to June 30, 1973, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1972," changing, adding and deleting certain appropriations to the Executive and Legislative Departments.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. As much as relates to certain appropriations to the Departments of Community Affairs, Education, Health, Justice, Property and Supplies, Public Welfare and State and to the Senate, House of Representatives and the Legislative Reference Bureau in section 2, act of July 7, 1972 (No.17-A), known as "The General Appropriation Act of 1972," is amended and an appropriation to the Department of Education is added before the appropriation to public libraries to read:

Section 2. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the General Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of the salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expense of the duly elected or appointed officers and employes of the Commonwealth, for payment of fees of contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods, services, printing, equipment, land and buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1972, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1972.

AN ACT

HB 192

Making an appropriation out of the Motor License Fund to the Treasury Department for refunding certain taxes to which the Commonwealth is not entitled.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of two million dollars (\$2,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of the Motor License Fund to the Treasury Department for the fiscal year July 1, 1972 to June 30, 1973 for the payment of approved claims for the refunding of Liquid Fuels Taxes and Fuel Use Taxes collected from authorities which are exempt from payment of the Liquid Fuels Taxes and Fuel Use Taxes.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

HB 560

Amending the act of July 7, 1972 (No.18-A), entitled "An act making appropriations for emergency and disaster relief in connection with flooding and tropical storm disaster in the Commonwealth," to transfer funds among the several appropriations and to permit use of funds for damages caused by the flood of September, 1971.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Sections 1, 2 and 4, act of July 7, 1972 (No.18-A), entitled "An act making appropriations for emergency and disaster relief in connection with flooding and tropical storm disaster in the Commonwealth," are amended to read:

Section 1. The sum of [**one hundred thirteen million dollars (\$113,000,000)**] *one hundred forty-two million five hundred thousand dollars (\$142,500,000)*, or as much thereof as is necessary is hereby appropriated to the Governor for emergency and disaster relief especially in connection with the tropical storm and flood damage of *September, 1971 and* June, 1972; for emergency use in the alleviation of human hardship and suffering and for the protection of property; for the reimbursement to various departments and agencies of the Commonwealth for their participation in disaster relief activities, including, but not limited to, materials, supplies, services, food, clothing, equipment, chemicals, drugs and medicines; channel enlargement, rectification, realignment and side slope protection; and transportation, and for the payment of bills incurred in connection with the above purposes in the fiscal year ended June 30, 1972.

Section 2. The sum of [**twenty-five million dollars (\$25,000,000)**] *three million dollars (\$3,000,000)*, or as much thereof as may be necessary is hereby appropriated to the Governor for use under his direction by the Department of Public Welfare for assistance payments and county administration of the public assistance programs and medical assistance in connection with the flood and tropical storm disaster of June, 1972.

Section 4. The sum of [**ten million dollars (\$10,000,000)**] *two million five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000)*, or as much thereof as may be necessary is hereby appropriated to the Governor for use under his direction by the Department of Health for any and all health services in connection with the flood and tropical storm disaster of June, 1972.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

SB 251

Making an appropriation to finance certain social services for the aged by the Department of Public Welfare.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of one million dollars (\$1,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1973. It is the express purpose of this act to provide certain social service benefits for the aged to include benefits for those individuals otherwise qualified but who are not public assistance recipients.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

A SUPPLEMENT

SB 883

To the act of July 12, 1973 (No. 11-A), entitled "An act to provide for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 1973 to June 30, 1974, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1973," itemizing appropriations required from the Motor License Fund for the proper operations of the several departments of the Commonwealth authorized to spend Motor License Fund moneys.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. This supplement shall be known and may be cited as the "Motor License Fund Supplement to the General Appropriation Act of 1973."

Section 2. The following sums or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or appointed officers and employes of the Commonwealth, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1973 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1973.

To the Department of Transportation

For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the proper administration of the Department of Transportation, including planning and research, engineering, right-of-way, highway construction, special construction, maintenance, service functions and transportation safety \$332,000,000

In addition to this amount, all moneys received from the Federal Government or from any other source as contributions to or payments for this program shall be paid into the Motor License Fund and credited to this appropriation.

For payment from the restricted revenue accounts for aviation fuel taxes and airport operations revenue, for aviation operations including the operation and maintenance of State-owned aircraft, payment of general expenses, supplies, printing and equipment; for the

development and maintenance of State airports and the maintenance and repair of landing fields, intermediate landing fields, landing field equipment, beacon sites, other navigation facilities, and the encouragement and development of civil aeronautics 3,620,000

In addition to this amount, all moneys received from the Federal Government or from any other source as contributions to or payments for this program shall be paid into the Motor License Fund and credited to this appropriation.

For payment of interest and principal on State Highway and Bridge Authority bonds issued for highway purposes 38,000,000

For payments to municipalities to assist in maintenance and construction costs of roads in accordance with the act of June 1, 1956 (P.L.1944, No.655) relative to the allocation of highway funds 85,000,000

For payment from the restricted revenue account for aviation fuel taxes for airport construction and development including encouragement and development of aeronautics, development of State airports, assistance to political subdivisions and municipal authorities in the construction and improvement of airports and other aeronautical facilities..... 2,000,000

No more shall be expended from this item for such purpose or any of them than may be required to match an equal sum contributed by any political subdivision, or municipality authority of the Commonwealth or by the Federal Government, or by a political subdivision or municipality authority and the Federal Government as provided in the act of May 2, 1947 (P.L.136, No.56), relating to Federal aid for airports.

In addition to the amounts appropriated by this act, all moneys received from the Federal Government or from any other source as contributions to or payments for the programs provided herein shall be paid into the Motor License Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the Motor License Fund for the purposes and programs intended.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 1973.

No. 10-A

AN ACT

SB 394

Appropriating moneys in the Land and Water Development Fund derived from the issuance and sale of bonds and notes pursuant to the act of January 19, 1968 (P.L.996, No.443), known as "The Land and Water Conservation and Reclamation Act."

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums are hereby appropriated for the periods and purposes specified from moneys in the Land and Water Development Fund derived from the issuance and sale of bonds and notes pursuant to the act of January 19, 1968 (P.L.996, No.443), known as "The Land and Water Conservation and Reclamation Act":

(1) The sum of forty million dollars (\$40,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for two fiscal years beginning July 1, 1973, to the Department of Environmental Resources for the purposes specified in clause (1) of subsection (a) of section 16 of the act.

(2) The sum of twenty-five million dollars (\$25,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for two fiscal years beginning July 1, 1973, to the Department of Environmental Resources, Fish and Game Commission and Historical and Museum Commission for the purposes specified in clause (3) of subsection (a) of section 16 of the act.

(3) The sum of fifteen million dollars (\$15,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for two fiscal years beginning July 1, 1973, to the Department of Community Affairs and the additional sum of fifteen million dollars (\$15,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for two fiscal years beginning July 1, 1973 to the Department of Community Affairs for the purposes specified in clause (4) of subsection (a) of section 16 of the act. Expenditures from such appropriation shall not be subject to the limitation set forth in subsection (c) of section 16 of this act. The balance of the foregoing appropriation which remains unexpended, unencumbered or uncommitted after June 30, 1975, shall not lapse but shall remain to the credit of the Department of Community Affairs until expended in accordance with the provisions of this appropriation.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1973.
