AN ACT

HB 1359

Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled "An act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession, consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores, for the payment of certain license fees to the respective municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures; providing for local option, and repealing existing laws," further providing for the employment of minors.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Clause (13) of section 493, act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the "Liquor Code," is amended to read:

Section 493. Unlawful Acts Relative to Liquor, Malt and Brewed Beverages and Licensees.—The term "licensee," when used in this section, shall mean those persons licensed under the provisions of Article IV, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

It shall be unlawful—

* * *

(13) Retail Licensees Employing Minors *Under Sixteen*. For any hotel, restaurant or club liquor licensee, or any retail dispenser, to employ any minor *under sixteen* or to permit any minor *under sixteen* to render any service whatever in or about the licensed premises, except in accordance with board regulations, nor shall any entertainer be employed or permitted to perform in any licensed premises in violation of the labor laws of this Commonwealth: *Provided, That minors from the age sixteen may be employed on licensed premises as food waitresses or waiters and busboys and busgirls.*

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
