Amending the act of June 22, 1931 (P.L.594, No.203), entitled "An act establishing certain township roads as State highways; authorizing their construction, maintenance, and improvement under certain conditions and restrictions; limiting the obligation of the Commonwealth in the construction of certain structures located on such highways; conferring certain powers upon the Department of Highways and local authorities, persons, associations and corporations for sharing the cost of the maintenance and construction of such highways; and making an appropriation to carry out the provisions of said act," changing a route in Upper Burrell Township, Westmoreland County.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following route established by the act of June 22, 1931 (P.L.594, No.203), entitled "An act establishing certain township roads as State highways; authorizing their construction, maintenance, and improvement under certain conditions and restrictions; limiting the obligation of the Commonwealth in the construction of certain structures located on such highways; conferring certain powers upon the Department of Highways and local authorities, persons, associations and corporations for sharing the cost of the maintenance and construction of such highways; and making an appropriation to carry out the provisions of said act," is amended to read:

Westmoreland County

Route 64018. Beginning at Route 737 at Drennen; and extending in a northeasterly direction to the Village of Merwin; **[thence in a northerly direction, by way of Wylie School,] beginning again at the intersection of L.R. 64181; thence in a northeasterly direction .7 mile to existing L.R. 64018; thence in a northerly direction** to the Village of Markle, in Westmoreland County, a distance of about **[5.9] 5.7** miles.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
