HB 2219

Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), entitled "An act concerning elections, including general, municipal, special and primary elections, the nomination of candidates, primary and election expenses and election contests; creating and defining membership of county boards of elections; imposing duties upon the Secretary of the Commonwealth, courts, county boards of elections, county commissioners; imposing penalties for violation of the act, and codifying, revising and consolidating the laws relating thereto; and repealing certain acts and parts of acts relating to elections," providing for a single campaign treasurer.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the "Pennsylvania Election Code," is amended by adding a section to read:

***Section 1602.1. Single Campaign Treasurer.—Every candidate who authorizes a committee, or committees, to receive and disburse funds on behalf of his candidacy, shall name a sole treasurer, irrespective of the number of committees so authorized, to receive and disburse all funds for said committees. Nothing herein shall be construed to prohibit a candidate from receiving or expending moneys on his behalf, or a treasurer of a political party committee or a committee authorized to receive and distribute funds on behalf of more than one candidate from receiving or expending moneys on behalf of said candidates notwithstanding the appointment of a sole treasurer or a sole treasurer from delegating in writing authority to any number of assistant treasurers to receive and disburse moneys collected on behalf of a candidate for nomination or election. Nothing in this section shall prohibit authorized individuals from selling tickets or soliciting funds when funds are deposited in the campaign account of the candidate.***

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
