Making an appropriation from the Public School Employees' Retirement Fund to provide for expenses of the Public School Employees' Retirement Board for the fiscal period July 1, 1976 to June 30, 1977 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1976.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$2,891,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated from the Public School Employees' Retirement Fund to the Public School Employees' Retirement Board for the payment of all salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses of the employees and members of the Public School Employees' Retirement Board, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities of the board for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1976 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1976.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1976.

Making an appropriation to the Department of Labor and Industry from the Workmen's Compensation Administration Fund to provide for the expenses of administering the Pennsylvania Workmen's Compensation Act and the Pennsylvania Occupational Disease Act for the fiscal period July 1, 1976 to June 30, 1977 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1976.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$5,922,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated from the Workmen's Compensation Administration Fund to the Department of Labor and Industry for the payment of all salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the administration of the Pennsylvania Workmen's Compensation Act and the Pennsylvania Occupational Disease Act for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1976 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1976.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1976.

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated out of the funds indicated to the Department of Environmental Resources for the fiscal period July 1, 1976 to June 30, 1977, for payment of annual fixed charges in lieu of taxes to political subdivisions or school districts on land acquired by the Commonwealth under Project 70 as provided in the act of June 22, 1964 (Sp. Sess., P.L.131, No.8), known as the "Project 70 Land Acquisition and Borrowing Act":

HB 460

Amending the act of June 30, 1975 (No. 8-A), entitled "An act to provide for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal period July 1, 1975 to June 30, 1976, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1975," changing appropriations to the Departments of Treasury, Community Affairs, Health and Justice, and to the Philadelphia Traffic Court and making an appropriation to the Department of Health for Tay-Sachs disease.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 2, act of June 30, 1975 (No.8-A), known as the "General Appropriation Act of 1975," is amended by amending appropriations to the Treasury Department for administration of the Board of Finance and Revenue; the Department of Community Affairs for housing and redevelopment, amended February 2, 1976 (No.2-A); to the Department of Health for health rehabilitation services-institutional, amended December 16, 1975 (No.50-A); to the Department of Justice for administration expenses for drug law enforcement, for the Juvenile Court Judges Commission and for the Bureau of Corrections, amended December 16, 1975 (No.50-A); and to the Philadelphia Traffic Court; and adding an appropriation to the Department of Health for a program relating to Tay-Sachs disease, to read:

Section 2. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the General Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of the salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expense of the duly elected or appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for payment of fees of contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods, services, printing, equipment, land and buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1975 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1975.

SB 1093

Making an appropriation out of the Motor License Fund to the Department of Transportation for the Appalachian Local Access Roads program.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$1,172,500, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated out of the Motor License Fund to the Department of Transportation for the Appalachian Local Access Roads program in accordance with the Appalachian Regional Development Act of 1965, Public Law 89-4, 89th Congress, S. 3, March 9, 1965, to carry out all of the powers and duties thereof, for the construction of access roads to public parks, resort areas and industrial centers.

Section 2. Reimbursement from the Federal Government under the provisions of the Appalachian Regional Development Act of 1965 for the construction of local access roads shall be specifically credited to this appropriation.

Section 3. The amounts herein appropriated shall lapse upon termination of such Federal programs or upon expenditure of funds originally appropriated, whichever is sooner.

Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

Section 1. This supplement shall be known and may be cited as the "Motor License Fund Supplement to the General Appropriation Act of 1976."

Section 2. The following sums or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1976 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1976.

To the Department of Transportation

For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the proper administration of the Department of Transportation, including the Transportation Commission and Advisory Committee, and the Statewide coordination of municipal services	\$ 22,668,000

Section 1. So much as relates to the appropriation to school districts for transportation to the Department of Education in section 2, act of June 28, 1975 (No.7-A), known as the "Federal Revenue Sharing Trust Fund Supplement to the General Appropriation Act of 1975," is amended to read:

Section 2. The following sums or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Federal Revenue Sharing Trust Fund for the fiscal period July 1, 1975 to June 30, 1976 to finance programs in the several hereinafter named agencies:

HB 1366

Appropriating the Federal augmentation to the Executive and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the fiscal period July 1, 1976 to June 30, 1977.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Federal Augmentation Appropriation Act of 1976."

Section 2. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying out the programs stated herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1976.

I. EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT

To the Governor

(a) For the Office of Human Resources

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum of \$151,000 appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for administration and operation:

(1) "Developmental Disabilities — Basic Support" — To plan, administer, provide services and contract facilities for the developmentally disabled	\$1,925,000
(2) "Partnership Grant for Services Integration" — To assess, coordinate and improve the delivery of human services at the State, county, and local levels	40,000
(3) "Appalachian Regional Commission Federal Grant" — To facilitate technical assistance and consultation for the Commonwealth Child Development Committee, regional and local committees, the State Appalachian Office and local child development programs in the Appalachian demonstration area	90,000

In addition to the amounts specifically appropriated herein to the Office of Human Resources, all moneys received from the Federal Government during any previous fiscal year, that are unexpended or unencumbered as of June 30, 1976, are hereby appropriated for the purpose of the respective appropriations.

(b) Office of Administration

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum of \$3,821,000 appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for administration:

- (1) "Comprehensive Employment and Training Act (CETA)" — To be used for a program of summer employment of young adults 750,000
- (2) "Comprehensive Employment and Training Act (CETA)" — For administration of Statewide Title 2 and Title 6 CETA programs including program monitoring and evaluation and implementation of CETA programs at local levels 500,000
- (3) "Intergovernmental Personnel Act" — For improvement of the State personnel system including but not limited to the completion of evaluation studies, the purchasing of equipment and the employment of consultants 200,000
- (4) "Law Enforcement Assistance — Telecommunications Grant" — For provision, by the Bureau of Management Services, of telecommunication consulting services to the Governor's Justice Commission 143,000

In addition to the amounts specifically appropriated herein to the Office of Administration, all moneys received from the Federal Government during any previous fiscal year that are unexpended or unencumbered as of June 30, 1976, are hereby appropriated for the purpose of the respective appropriations.

(c) For the Office of State Planning and Development

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum of \$1,063,000 appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for administration:

- (1) "Comprehensive Planning Assistance" — To undertake State land use policy planning activities 324,000
- (2) "Economic Development — Planning Assistance" — To undertake State economic development planning activities 188,000
- (3) "Outdoor Recreation — Acquisition, Development and Planning" — To undertake State recreation planning activities 170,000
- (4) "Appalachian State Research, Technical Assistance and Demonstration Projects" — To undertake citizen

participation development and demonstration project activities	100,000
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In addition to the amounts specifically appropriated herein to the Office of State Planning and Development, all moneys received from the Federal Government during any previous fiscal year, that are unexpended or unencumbered as of June 30, 1976, are hereby appropriated for the purpose of the respective appropriations.

(d) For the Human Relations Commission

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum of \$3,672,000 appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for administration:

“Job Discrimination Special Project Grants” — To undertake, identify and eliminate discrimination in employment due to race, color, religion, sex, ancestry or national origin, in hiring, recruitment, placement, promotion, referral, transfer, lay-off, discharge and other employment practices	460,000
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In addition to the amounts specifically appropriated herein to the Human Relations Commission, all moneys received from the Federal Government during any previous fiscal year, that are unexpended or unencumbered as of June 30, 1976, are hereby appropriated for the purpose of the respective appropriations.

(e) For the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum of \$1,004,000 appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for administration:

Section 6. Federal funds shall be encumbered or spent only to the extent that such funds are estimated as being available during the fiscal year of the Commonwealth.

Section 7. (a) No Federal funds which are carried forward from any previous fiscal year of the Commonwealth may be spent unless first appropriated herein by the General Assembly.

(b) No Federal funds shall be encumbered or used in excess of the amount authorized herein nor shall funds be reallocated between appropriations.

Section 8. This act shall take effect immediately.

As I stated in my veto message of Senate Bill No. 1542, it is my belief that Federal funds can only be appropriated by the United States Congress and that those funds are earmarked directly for the agencies and programs embodied in Federal legislation and regulations.

I am directing the Attorney General to take immediate legal steps to invalidate the provisions of Senate Bill No. 1542 as it has now become law and to invalidate the entire act which I now must reluctantly sign and to establish the principle that Federal funds go directly to the State or local government named in the Federal statute or regulation involved.

I must state clearly and unequivocally that were not social service programs involved—money for the schools, the elderly, the poor, and the infirm—I would veto House Bill No. 1366 in toto but as the new fiscal year begins tomorrow and as the Legislature will be in summer recess, if I were to veto House Bill No. 1366 in toto then a period of fiscal chaos would reign in State and local government.

By my action in allowing most provisions of this bill to become law, I do not condone the actions of the General Assembly in seemingly “appropriating” Federal moneys.

It is my belief that the General Assembly has no right to appropriate Federal moneys contrary to Federal law. I realize that some Federal programs, such as Revenue Sharing, do require the participation of the General Assembly. But the vast majority of the Federal programs are directed only to State executive agencies or local governments.

SB 1395

The sum of \$1,596,000 or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated from the State Employees' Retirement Fund to the State Employees' Retirement Board for the payment of all salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses of the employees and members of the State Employees' Retirement Board, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities of the board for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1976 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1976.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1976.

SB 1584

Making appropriations to the Thomas Jefferson University of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. (a) The sum of \$3,969,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Thomas Jefferson University of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, for the fiscal period July 1, 1976 to June 30, 1977, for instruction in the Doctor of Medicine program.

(b) The sum of \$1,500,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Thomas Jefferson University of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, for the fiscal period July 1, 1976 to June 30, 1977, for the general maintenance of the Thomas Jefferson University including the College of Allied Health Sciences.

Section 2. Payments to the Thomas Jefferson University of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on account of the appropriation for instructions in the Doctor of Medicine program as provided in section 1(a) shall be made on the basis of full-time student enrollment at the rate of \$4,400 per student.

Section 3. Payments to the Thomas Jefferson University of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on account of the appropriation provided in section 1(b) shall be made on the basis of cost during the fiscal period.

Section 4. The university shall provide such information and in such form and manner as the Department of Education may prescribe.

Section 5. The Thomas Jefferson University of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in the "Higher Education Finance Manual of 1975," without exception.

Section 6. This act shall take effect July 1, 1976.

SB 1585

Making appropriations to the Trustees of the Hahnemann Medical College and Hospital of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

Section 1. (a) The sum of \$3,067,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the Hahnemann Medical College of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, for its fiscal period July 1, 1976 to June 30, 1977, for instruction in the Doctor of Medicine program.

(b) The sum of \$209,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the Hahnemann Medical College of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania for its fiscal period July 1, 1976 to June 30, 1977 for instruction in the Allied Health, Professions and Graduate School of the Hahnemann Medical College.

Section 2. Payments to the Hahnemann Medical College of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on account of the appropriation for instruction in the Doctor of Medicine program as provided in section 1(a) shall be made on the basis of full-time student enrollment at the rate of \$4,400 per student.

Section 3. The college shall provide such information and in such form and manner as the Department of Education may prescribe.

Section 4. The Hahnemann Medical College of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in the "Higher Education Finance Manual of 1975" without exception.

Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 1976.

SB 1586

Making an appropriation to The Medical College of Pennsylvania, East Falls, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 2. None of the above appropriation shall be used in connection with any facility in Pennsylvania for the manufacture or assembly of motor vehicles by a foreign-based manufacturer except under the following conditions:

All assembly parts, tools and special machinery transported from a foreign port via ocean from a foreign-based manufacturer shall use a Pennsylvania port as a receiving point: Provided, That the total transportation costs to the manufacturer, availability of facilities, frequency of shipments, and conditions of delivery are competitive.

Section 3. Any moneys of this appropriation which are uncommitted, unencumbered or unexpended on June 30, 1977 shall lapse.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 1976.

SB 1599

Making an appropriation to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the general maintenance and operation of the Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$4,500,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal period July 1, 1976 to June 30, 1977, for the general maintenance and operation of the Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic by the University of Pittsburgh and the purchase of such apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interest of the purposes of the institute and clinic, which purposes shall include the teaching of personnel for the staffs of the various mental institutions of the Commonwealth and the conduct of research in the treatment, prevention and cause of the various types of nervous disorders and mental diseases in compliance with the laws, providing for the lease of the Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic to the University of Pittsburgh. In addition to the above amount all income and all moneys collected at the institute and paid into the General Fund of the State Treasury under existing laws are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund to the institute for the same purposes, the institute to receive from such appropriation the exact amount which was collected at said institute during the said fiscal period.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1976.

APPROVED—This 9th day of July, A. D. 1976, in the sum of \$4,000,000. I withhold my approval from the balance of this appropriation because funds in excess of \$4,000,000 were not included in my 1976-1977 budget for this purpose.

Title 2 - Public service employment programs - subgrants to prime sponsors.

support systems for handicapped learners and to provide education diagnosis and remediation programs for handicapped children.

(9) "Adult Indo-Chinese Refugee Education Program" - To reimburse schools which have been providing English as a second language program for refugees and for State level special projects.

(10) "Higher Education Act of 1965; Community Services Program" - For grants to universities assisting university communities in alleviating problems.

(11) "Higher Education Act of 1965; Teachers Program" - To provide financial support for the training or retraining of vocational education personnel.

Department of Justice

(1) "Federal Law Enforcement Assistance Grants" - For implementation of the State's comprehensive Statewide law enforcement improvement program involving: improvement of police operations; improvement of the courts and corrections systems; crime prevention; reduction of organized crime; improvement of community relations; research; and prevention and control of juvenile delinquency. Section 3. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) that part of all appropriations in this act unexpended, uncommitted and unencumbered as of June 30, 1977 shall automatically lapse as of that date.

(b) The appropriation to the Department of Community Affairs for housing and redevelopment assistance and the appropriations to the Legislative Department shall be continuing appropriations.

Section 4. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any appropriation under the provisions of this act which is the same or similar to an appropriation under the act of June 4, 1976 (No.7-A), entitled "An act to provide for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal period July 1, 1976 to June 30, 1977, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal

period ending June 30, 1976," or the act of July 1, 1976 (No.17-A), entitled "An act appropriating the Federal augmentation to the Executive and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the fiscal period July 1, 1976 to June 30, 1977," shall replace such appropriation.

Section 5. (a) The act of June 4, 1976 (No.7-A), known as the "General Appropriation Act of 1976," is repealed insofar as it is inconsistent herewith.

(b) The act of July 1, 1976 (No.17-A), known as the "Federal Augmentation Appropriation Act of 1976," is repealed insofar as it is inconsistent herewith.

Section 6. This act shall take effect immediately.

I wish to reiterate my position as contained in my veto message of Senate Bill No. 1542 that the General Assembly has no right to appropriate Federal moneys contrary to Federal law. By my action in allowing the Federal Augmentation Funds section of the bill to become law, I do not condone the actions of the General Assembly in seemingly "appropriating" Federal moneys.

I must state again, clearly and unequivocally, that were it not for the involvement of social service programs - those that aid citizens - I would veto this section of House Bill No. 2359. However, since the Legislature adjourned sine die, if I were to veto this section these citizens would be the ones to suffer. Therefore, I must reluctantly accept this segment of the bill.
