## AN ACT

## SB 656

Amending the act of June 23, 1931 (P.L.932, No.317), entitled "An act relating to cities of the third class; and amending, revising, and consolidating the law relating thereto," further providing for membership on civil service boards.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 4402, act of June 23, 1931 (P.L.932, No.317), known as "The Third Class City Code," reenacted and amended June 28, 1951 (P.L.662, No.164), is amended to read:

Section 4402. Appointment of Examining Boards.—There shall be the following civil service boards in each city: (a) A board for the examination of applicants for appointment to any position in the police department; (b) a board for the examination of applicants for appointment as health officers other than registered physicians, or as sanitary policemen or inspectors of the health department; (c) a board for the examination of applicants for appointment to any position in the engineering or electrical departments, except as otherwise provided for by law, or to the position of building inspectors.

Each of said boards shall consist of three citizens, who shall be elected by council for terms of four years or until their successors are elected and qualified. [One of the members of the boards, provided for in clauses (a) and (b) of this section, shall be an educator and one shall be a physician.] Any person who is a registered elector of the city may be appointed to one or more of said boards. No city officer, official or employe shall be eligible for appointment to any civil service board.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
