Amending the act of May 9, 1949 (P.L.919, No.257), entitled "An act designating certain clerks of courts agents of the Commonwealth in the collection and transmission of fines, forfeited recognizances and other forfeitures imposed, lost or forfeited into any court for the use of the Commonwealth; prescribing their powers and duties; fixing their compensation; and providing procedures for transmission and settlement of certain moneys," changing the days for rendering certain returns to the Department of Revenue, and providing for evidence of timely filing.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 3, act of May 9, 1949 (P.L.919, No.257), entitled "An act designating certain clerks of courts agents of the Commonwealth in the collection and transmission of fines, forfeited recognizances and other forfeitures imposed, lost or forfeited into any court for the use of the Commonwealth; prescribing their powers and duties; fixing their compensation; and providing procedures for transmission and settlement of certain moneys," amended November 10, 1959 (P.L.1405, No.501), is amended to read:

Section 3. [On the first Monday after the first Tuesday of each] Not later than the fifteenth day of the following month it shall be the duty of every clerk of court to render to the Department of Revenue, under oath or affirmation, return of all fines received during the preceding month for the use of the Commonwealth, under the provisions of this act, and to pay the same into the State Treasury through the Department of Revenue, less any compensation herein allowable. Presentation of a receipt indicating that the fines were mailed by registered or certified mail on or before the deadline date shall be evidence of timely filing.

Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
