Amending the act of January 24, 1966 (1965, P.L.1535, No.537), entitled, as amended, "An act providing for the planning and regulation of community sewage systems and individual sewage systems; requiring municipalities to submit plans for systems in their jurisdiction; authorizing grants; requiring permits for persons installing such systems; requiring disclosure statements in certain land sale contracts; authorizing the Department of Environmental Resources to adopt and administer rules, regulations, standards and procedures; creating an advisory committee; providing remedies and prescribing penalties," further providing for the disposition of penalties.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 13, act of January 24, 1966 (1965 P.L.1535, No.537), known as the "Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act," amended July 22, 1974 (P.L.621, No.208), is amended to read:

Section 13. Penalties.—Any person who shall violate any provision of section 7 of this act or the rules, regulations or standards promulgated thereunder or who resists or interferes with any officer, agent or employe of a local agency or the department, in accordance with the provisions of this act, in the performance of his duties, shall be guilty of a summary offense. Upon conviction thereof in a summary proceeding before any district justice, justice of the peace, alderman or magistrate in the county, *city, borough, town or township* in which the offense was committed, such person shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than one hundred dollars (\$100) and costs, and not more than three hundred dollars (\$300) and costs, *such costs* to be paid to said county, *and the fine to be paid to the said city, borough, town or township in which the offense was committed*, or in default thereof, shall be confined in the county jail for a period of not more than thirty days.

Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
