## AN ACT

SB 820

Amending the act of September 27, 1961 (P.L.1700, No.699), entitled "An act relating to the regulation of the practice of pharmacy, including the sales, use and distribution of drugs and devices at retail; and amending, revising, consolidating and repealing certain laws relating thereto," further providing for licensing of pharmacy interns.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Subsection (b) of section 3, act of September 27, 1961 (P.L.1700, No.699), known as the "Pharmacy Act," is amended to read: Section 3. Licensing of Pharmacists.—\* \* \*

(b) The State Board of Pharmacy shall, at least once in every six months, examine in the practice of pharmacy all pharmacy interns, who have completed their educational requirements, who shall make applications for said examination pursuant to regulations promulgated by the board. The said examination shall consist of two parts: the first part being a theoretical examination, the second part consisting of a practical examination which shall be given to all pharmacy interns who [have successfully passed the theoretical examination and] have satisfactorily completed their internship requirements. In case of failure at a first examination, the applicant shall have within two years the privilege of a second and third examination. In case of failure in a third examination, the applicant shall have the privilege of examination only after satisfactorily completing additional preparation as directed and approved by the board.

Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
