A SUPPLEMENT

SB 853

To the act of April 1, 1863 (P.L.213, No.227), entitled "An act to accept the grant of Public Lands, by the United States, to the several states, for the endowment of Agricultural Colleges," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect, providing for a basis for payments of such appropriations and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. In order to carry into effect the act of Congress, approved July 2, 1862, granting public land to the several states for educational purposes, and subsequent acts of Congress related thereto, and the act of the General Assembly of Pennsylvania accepting the provisions and conditions of said acts of Congress and pledging the faith of the State to carry the same into effect, the following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the Pennsylvania State University for the fiscal year July 1, 1981 to June 30, 1982, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(1)	For educational and general expenses	\$99,913,000
(2)	For cost of student aid	1,760,000
(3)	For cost of agricultural research	10,831,000
(4)	For cost of agricultural extension services	9,166,000
(5)	For cost of research	9,100,000
(6)	For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only	2,896,000
(7)	For cost of soil survey	100,000

- Section 2. (a) Payments to Pennsylvania State University on account of the appropriations for all items as provided in section 1 except for instruction Doctor of Medicine shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.
- (b) Payments for instruction Doctor of Medicine shall be made on the basis of full-time students enrollment at a rate not to exceed \$7,465 per student.
- Section 3. If necessary, the Pennsylvania State University may transfer funds among the appropriations listed in section 1, clauses (1), (2), (3) (4) and (5): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.
- Section 4. (a) Payments to the Pennsylvania State University of the appropriations herein provided shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.
- (b) Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of sections 2 and 3, on the basis of estimated costs and full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program. The estimate

of costs shall be submitted by the Pennsylvania State University to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and to the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

- Section 5. Notwithstanding any provision of the General Appropriation Act of 1981 relating to the payment of retirement expenses, the Trustees of the Pennsylvania State University shall make all required payments to the State Employees' Retirement Fund from the funds appropriated pursuant to this act.
- Section 6. (a) The Pennsylvania State University shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, the Pennsylvania State University shall file with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly, and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year, the number of full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs, as provided in sections 2 and 3, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.
- (b) Such statement of expenditures and number of full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by the Pennsylvania State University to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. The Auditor General shall also make a determination of full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs and make a certification as to their correctness. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning such expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.
- Section 7. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives and shall include data for all programs except the Doctor of Medicine program. The report, to be submitted prior to September 1, 1982, shall cover the 12-month period beginning with the summer term 1981 and shall include:
- (1) The following counts and distributions for each term during the period:
- (i) The definitions and numbers of faculty members employed fultime, of faculty members employed part-time, of full-time students enrolled in graduate courses, of full-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses, of part-time students enrolled in graduate courses, and of part-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses.

- (ii) Total numbers of undergraduate student credit hours, divided into lower division and upper division course levels, and of graduate student credit hours divided into three course levels—master's, first professional and doctoral.
- (iii) Number of different courses scheduled by level of instruction and the number of sections of individual instruction at each level of instruction.
 - (iv) Number of terms scheduled and the dates thereof.
- (2) For the summer term and the following academic year in total and for each two-digit Hegis category of instructional programs in higher education as defined by the National Center for Education Statistics, United States Department of Education, a classification of faculty members or other professional employees by title including: professor, associate professor, assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, research associate, librarian and academic administrator; faculty members or other professional employees under each title to be subdivided by type of assignment: teaching and nonteaching, and each such set of faculty members or other professional employees to be further subdivided by type of employment: full-time or part-time and the following aggregates for each such subdivided classification:
- (i) The number of faculty and other professional employees and their full-time equivalence in instructional and noninstructional functions.
- (ii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate classroom courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate classroom courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.
- (iii) The sum of undergraduate classroom student credit hours and the sum of graduate classroom student credit hours generated; divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.
- (iv) The sum of undergraduate individual instruction student credit hours and the sum of graduate individual instruction student credit hours generated; divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.
- (v) Total salary paid for instructional functions and for noninstructional functions and the amount of this salary paid for each of these functions from college or university funds, Federal funds and other funds.
- (3) For each term of the period covered for each faculty member employed full-time identified by two-digit Hegis category and title, the report shall contain an analysis of the average hours per week spent in college or university-related activities, stating specifically hours spent in undergraduate classroom contact and graduate classroom contact, hours spent in preparation, hours spent in research and hours spent in public service.
- Section 8. (a) In addition to the above requirements relative to this appropriation, the report covering the 12-month period beginning with the summer term 1981, shall include for all programs of the university:

- (1) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureate degree and for a master's degree.
- (2) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, first professional degrees, and doctoral degrees awarded in 1979, 1980, 1981 and estimated 1982.
- (b) The university shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with "Higher Education Finance Manual" (1975).
- Section 9. The university shall provide such information as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this act and in such form and manner as the Department of Education may prescribe.

Section 10. The Pennsylvania State University shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in "Higher Education Finance Manual" United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare (1975) with the exceptions set forth in the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for State Related Universities, Phase I, Fiscal Year 1981-1982." Credits granted for nontraditional programs such as CLEP, lifelong learning etc., including all related costs and revenues thereof shall be excluded from the function of "Instruction" and included under "Public Service."

Section 11. In addition to the requirements of section 7, the Pennsylvania State University shall, by March 1, 1982, submit to the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and the House of Representatives a breakdown of the funds budgeted for this fiscal year for the main campus and each branch campus including expenditures budgeted from this act and expenditures budgeted from moneys other than those appropriated by this act.

Section 12. This act shall take effect July 1, 1981.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1981 to June 30, 1982, for the purpose and in the amounts as shown:

(2)	For operations of the Titusville Campus	560,000
(3)	For cost of student aid	2,960,000

- Section 2. (a) Payments to the University of Pittsburgh on account of the appropriations for all items, as provided in section 1 except for instruction Doctor of Medicine shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.
- (b) Payments for instruction Doctor of Medicine shall be made on the basis of full-time student enrollment at a rate not to exceed \$7,465 per student.
- Section 3. If necessary the University of Pittsburgh may transfer funds between the appropriations listed in section 1, paragraphs (1) and (2): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.
- Section 4. (a) Payments to the University of Pittsburgh of the appropriations herein provided shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.
- (b) Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of section 2 on the basis of estimated costs and full-time

students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by the University of Pittsburgh to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

- Section 5. (a) The University of Pittsburgh shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, the University of Pittsburgh shall file with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly, the Auditor General of the Commonwealth and the chief administrator of each branch campus, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year, the number of full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs, as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.
- (b) Such statement of expenditures, and number of full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by the University of Pittsburgh to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. The Auditor General shall also make a determination of full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs and make a certification as to their correctness. To the act of November 30, 1965 (P.L.843, No.355), entitled "An act providing for the establishment and operation of Temple University as an instrumentality of the Commonwealth to serve as a State-related university in the higher education system of the Commonwealth; providing for change of name; providing for the composition of the board of trustees; terms of trustees, and the power and duties of such trustees; providing for preference to Pennsylvania residents in tuition; providing for public support and capital improvements; authorizing appropriations in amounts to be fixed annually by the General Assembly; providing for the auditing of accounts of expenditures from said appropriations; authorizing the issuance of bonds exempt from taxation within the Commonwealth; requiring the President to make an annual report of the operations of Temple University," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect, providing for a basis for payments of such appropriation and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of Temple University at Philadelphia for the fiscal year July 1, 1981 to June 30, 1982, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(2)	For cost of student aid	3,018,000
(3)	For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only	5,435,000
(4)	For operation of dental clinics in the school of

- Section 2. (a) Payments to Temple University on account of the appropriations for all items, as provided in section 1, except for instruction Doctor of Medicine, shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.
- (b) Payments for instruction Doctor of Medicine only shall be made on the basis of full-time students enrolled at the rate of \$7,465 per student.
- Section 3. If necessary, Temple University may transfer funds among the appropriations listed in section 1, clauses (1) and (2): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.
- Section 4. (a) Payment to Temple University of the appropriations herein provided shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.
- (b) Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of sections 2 and 3, on the basis of estimated costs and full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program. The estimate

of costs shall be submitted by Temple University to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and to the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

- Temple University shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates. Temple University shall file with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year the number of full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs, as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year. Section 8. The university shall provide such information as may be necessary to carry out this act and in such form and manner as the Department of Education may prescribe.

Section 9. The university shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in "Higher Education Finance Manual" United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare (1975) with the exceptions set forth in the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for State Related Universities, Phase I, Fiscal Year 1981-1982." Credits granted for nontraditional programs such as CLEP, lifelong learning etc., including all related costs and revenues thereof shall be excluded from the function of "Instruction" and included under "Public Service."

(b) The funds appropriated in subsection (a) shall be in addition to and subject to the provisions of the act of July 1, 1981 (No.5A), known as the "General Appropriations Act of 1981," as reduced by any other act.

Section 12. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

SB 618

Providing for the reduction of General Fund appropriations for the fiscal year 1981-1982; and directing the Governor to take appropriate action to balance the budget.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

- Section 1. (a) The Federal Economic Recovery Program recently enacted and embodied in the Economic Recovery Act of 1981 (Public Law 97-34) and the Omnibus Reconciliation Act of 1981 (Public Law 97-35) will cause a serious shortfall in Commonwealth revenues as well as a substantial reduction in Federal funds available for Commonwealth programs. As a result, the 1981-1982 fiscal year General Fund budget of the Commonwealth will be seriously out of balance unless immediate action is taken to adjust the 1981-1982 appropriations and expenditures in conformity with available revenues.
- (b) To reduce the impact of the reductions on any particular program, a general reduction in appropriations must be made.
- Section 2. Each and every 1981-1982 fiscal year General Fund appropriation, except the appropriations to the Department of Education for payment of subsidies to school districts on account of basic instructional costs, for the purpose of protecting school districts from receiving less basic instructional subsidy money than was received during the fiscal period 1980-1981, for payments for student supplies for nonpublic schools, for payments on account of vocational education programs, for payments to school districts and intermediate units on account of pupil transportation; for payments on account of nonpublic school transportation; for payments to school districts, intermediate units and approved private schools on account of special education of exceptional children and for grants to public libraries for the development and improvement of a Statewide system of libraries and library services and except appropriations to the Department of Public Welfare for county administration of the public assistance and medical assistance programs and for cash assistance grants, is hereby reduced by 1% of the amount of money previously appropriated in the act of July 1, 1981 (No.5A), known as the "General Appropriation Act of 1981," or any other acts making preferred appropriations for the 1981-1982 fiscal year.
- Section 3. The provisions of this act shall supersede all other acts or parts of acts which require or mandate payments to school districts, persons, or other entities. Each State agency shall take all steps required to reduce operations to the level necessitated by the provisions of this section.

Section 4. The General Assembly directs the Governor to take all action necessary to balance the 1981-1982 General Fund budget including, but not limited to, the revision of the official revenue estimate and the abatement of other appropriations.

Section 5. This act shall take effect immediately.
