SB 929

To provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the Executive. Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal period July 1, 1982 to June 30, 1983, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1982; providing for an appropriation for the fiscal period July 1, 1982 to June 30, 1983 from the Lottery Fund for aging programs; itemizing appropriations required from the Motor License Fund for the fiscal period July 1, 1982 to June 30, 1983 for the proper operation of the several departments of the Commonwealth authorized to spend Motor License Fund moneys and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1982; itemizing appropriations of the Federal Augmentation to the Executive and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth; establishing restricted receipts accounts for the fiscal period July 1. 1982 to June 30, 1983 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1982; providing additional funds for various departments of the Commonwealth for the fiscal period July 1, 1981 to June 30, 1982; providing additional General Fund appropriations from funds reserved from fiscal year 1980-1981 and providing additional appropriations from the Federal augmentation funds for the fiscal period July 1, 1981 to June 30, 1982.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

PART I General Provisions

Section 101. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "General Appropriation Act of 1982."

Section 102. For purposes of this act, the following words and phrases shall have, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, the meanings given to them in this section:

"Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists, engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries, auditors, inspectors, examiners, statisticians, marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and other assistants in any department, board or commission.

"Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies, traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, telephones and telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and notices, fuel, light, heat, power and water, minor construction and renovation, repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on workmen's compensation, insurance premiums on policies of liability

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insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth share of social security taxes and unemployment compensation costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside hospital: Provided, That in no case shall the State institution pay more for patient care than that provided under the State medical assistance program.

PART II General Fund Appropriations 1982-1983

Section 201. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the General Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expense of the duly elected or appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for payment of fees of contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods, services, printing, equipment, land and buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1982 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1982.

and for offices of justices and judges of the Supreme, Superior and Commonwealth Courts in the county of their residence. Reimbursement shall be provided on the following basis. For each common pleas court judge authorized position, whether filled or vacant, within a judicial district, and for each justice or judge of the appellate courts, \$70,000 per authorized position shall be provided. The total amount of costs from all sources incurred for justices and judges of the appellate courts shall not exceed \$70,000 per justice or judge of an appellate court. Judicial districts comprising more than one county shall be entitled to receive \$70,000 per authorized common pleas court judge position; the amount payable to each county shall be determined by the proportion of the individual county's population in relation to the population of the entire judicial district. No county shall be reimbursed for costs above the actual direct costs. excluding capital outlays, incurred by them for the operation of all courts. For the purposes of reimbursement for common pleas court judge authorized positions, no county shall receive less than 75% of the actual reimbursement for court costs provided to them from funds appropriated for the fiscal period July 1, 1980 to June 30, 1981.

For the purpose of determining the actual direct costs incurred by the counties in the administration and operation of all courts, the costs as reported to the Department of Community Affairs in the county's annual financial report forms under the heading (a) "Judicial," but confined to the subheading: (160) courts, excluding capital outlay shall be used. If a city coterminous with a county does not report on the Department of Community Affairs' form, its figures from the same subheading, set forth in the department forms, shall be used.

All payments for reimbursement shall be made to the county treasurer and in cities of the first class coterminous with counties of the first class to the city treasurer.

In making allocations and payments hereunder, the Court Administrator of Pennsylvania shall, except for county offices of justices and judges of the Supreme, Superior and Commonwealth Courts, exclude all costs which are not properly reportable under the heading herein above specified......

SUBPART III Restricted Receipt Accounts

Section 521. The Secretary of the Budget may create the following restricted receipt accounts for the purpose of administering Federal grants only for the purposes herein designated during the fiscal period July 1, 1982 through June 30, 1983.

(b) With the exception of Federal money received under the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration and social services block grant, subgrants may be made between appropriations without further approval of the General Assembly. The Budget Secretary shall submit a list of subgrants to the Chairman of the House and Senate Appropriations Committee quarterly. No subgrant to a State agency, however, may be made from a restricted receipt without a specific appropriation by the General Assembly.

Section 565. In addition to the moneys appropriated by this act, all moneys received from the Federal Government for the purpose of disas-

ter assistance or relief shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund to the departments, boards, commissions or agencies designated by the Governor.

Section 566. In the event of any emergency situation in which the Legislature cannot act in sufficient time, the Governor is authorized through Executive authorization to provide up to \$5,000,000 in Federal funds to alleviate the emergency situation. For the purposes of this section "emergency" is defined as any situation in which there is a chance of, or may result in, substantial human suffering.

Section 704. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any appropriation under the provisions of this part which is the same or similar to an appropriation under the act of December 21, 1981 (P.L.776, No.56A), known as the "Supplemental Federal Augmentation Appropriation Act of 1981," shall replace such appropriations.

Section 705. The act of December 21, 1981 (P.L.776, No.56A), known as the "Supplemental Federal Augmentation Appropriation Act of 1981," is repealed insofar as it is inconsistent with the provisions of this part.

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PART VIII Miscellaneous Provisions

Section 801. This act is not intended to be inconsistent with or to repeal any provision of any act enacted at this or any prior session of the General Assembly regulating the purchase of supplies, the ordering of printing and binding, the purchase, maintenance and use of automobiles, the method of making payments from the State Treasury for any purpose or the functioning of any administrative department, board or commission.

Section 802. No appropriation made by this act to any department, board, commission or agency of the Executive Department shall be available unless and until such department, board, commission or agency shall have complied with sections 615 and 616 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as "The Administrative Code of 1929."

Section 803. Purchase of supplies, materials and equipment shall not be deemed to be committed or encumbered until contracts covering said purchase have been entered into with the vendors.

- Section 804. (a) In addition to the amounts appropriated by this act, moneys received in payment for food and household supplies furnished to employees and other persons, except inmates, by an institution, and moneys received from the proceeds from the sale of any products of the soil, meats, livestock, timber, or other materials sold by the department shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund to the several respective institutions for the operation and maintenance of said institutions.
- (b) In addition to the amounts appropriated by this act, all moneys received from any other source, except the Federal Government, as contributions for the programs provided herein, or as payment for services or materials furnished by one institution to another, except those collections designated as revenues, shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund for the purposes of the respective appropriations.
- (c) In addition to any funds specifically appropriated by this act, all moneys received by a department or agency of the Commonwealth from any other sources, except the Federal Government, as contributions or supplements to the department or agency for a program or administration of an act included in this act shall be paid into the General Fund and credited to the appropriation for that program or administration of the act.
- Section 805. (a) Except as provided in subsections (b), (c) and (d), that part of all appropriations in Part II unexpended, uncommitted or unencumbered as of June 30, 1983 shall automatically lapse as of that date.
- (b) The appropriation in Part II to the Department of Community Affairs for grants for housing, community revitalization and enterprise development shall lapse on June 30, 1984.

- (c) The appropriation in Part II to the Department of General Services for the payment of tort claims shall be a continuing appropriation and the appropriation for printing and distribution of the Pennsylvania Manual shall lapse on June 30, 1984.
- (d) The appropriations in Part II to the Legislative Department shall be continuing appropriations. All moneys made available to the Legislative Department remaining unspent and unencumbered from appropriations made for the fiscal year 1977-1978 and prior years shall lapse into the General Fund.

PART IX Effective Date

Section 901. Except for Parts VI and VII of this act which shall take effect immediately, the remainder of this act shall take effect July 1, 1982, or if enacted subsequent to that date, immediately.
