Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1225, No.316), entitled "An act concerning game and other wild birds and wild animals; and amending, revising, consolidating, and changing the law relating thereto," further providing for deerproof and elk-proof fences.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 1302 of the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1225, No.316), known as The Game Law, amended May 12, 1982 (P.L.412, No.119), is amended to read:

Section 1302. [Amount Available for Deer-Proof and Elk-Proof Fences.—Not to exceed twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) annually may be expended by the commission from the Game Fund for the purchase of woven wire fencing and staples, or fencing wire and wire fasteners, for the erection of deer-proof and elk-proof fences in accordance with the provisions of this article.] Limitation on Expenditures for Deterrent Fencing.— The director may spend up to thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000) annually from the Game Fund for the purchase of fencing, posts, staples, electric generators and other materials necessary for the erection of deer, elk or bear deterrent fences in accordance with the provisions of this act.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
