Designating January 30, Franklin Delano Roosevelt's birthday, as "Day of the Disabled"

WHEREAS, Over 1,000,000 citizens of this Commonwealth are considered to be physically disabled; and

WHEREAS, Through courage and determination, the physically disabled have conquered seemingly insurmountable obstacles to lead successful lives; and

WHEREAS, The physically disabled demonstrate unique character and perseverance in pursuing and attaining their desired goals; and

WHEREAS, These individuals have made noteworthy contributions to their communities, this Commonwealth and the nation; and

WHEREAS, The physically disabled of this Commonwealth deserve the recognition of this Commonwealth and its citizens.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Day of the disabled.

In honor of the birthday of one of America's most distinguished physically disabled individuals, Franklin Delano Roosevelt, January 30 of each year is hereby designated as "Day of the Disabled," in recognition and in honor of the disabled citizens of Pennsylvania.

Section 2. Effective date.

This act shall take effect immediately.
