A SUPPLEMENT

HB 1743

To the act of July 3, 1987 (P.L.190, No.26), entitled "An act providing for the capital budget for the fiscal year 1987-1988," itemizing public improvement projects, furniture and equipment projects, transportation assistance projects and flood control projects to be constructed or acquired or assisted by the Department of General Services, the Department of Transportation or the Department of Environmental Resources, together with their estimated financial costs; authorizing the incurring of debt without the approval of the electors for the purpose of financing the projects to be constructed or acquired or assisted by the Department of General Services, the Department of Transportation or the Department of Environmental Resources; stating the estimated useful life of the projects; making appropriations; and making a repeal.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Short title.

This act shall be known and may be cited as the Capital Budget Project Itemization Act for 1987-1988.

Section 2. Total authorizations.

- (a) Public improvements.—The total authorization for the additional capital projects in the category of public improvement projects itemized in section 3 and to be acquired or constructed by the Department of General Services, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt, shall be \$1,604,230,000.
- (b) Furniture and equipment.—The total authorization for the additional capital projects in the category of public improvement projects consisting of the acquisition of original movable furniture and equipment to complete public improvement projects itemized in section 4 and to be purchased by the Department of General Services, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt, shall be \$22,677,000.
- (c) Transportation assistance.—The total authorization for the capital projects in the category of transportation assistance projects itemized in section 5 with respect to which an interest is to be acquired in or constructed by the Department of Transportation, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt, shall be \$226,583,000.
- (d) Redevelopment assistance.—The total authorization for the capital projects in the category of redevelopment assistance projects itemized in section 6 for capital grants by the Department of Community Affairs, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt, shall be \$563,598,000.

Section 3. Itemization of public improvement projects.

Section 7. Port Corporation restrictions.	

- Section 7. Port Corporation restrictions.
- (a) Contracts.—As a condition of the Commonwealth's initial and continued participation in the capital construction projects authorized under section 3(13)(xxi) for the Philadelphia Port Corporation, the policies of the Port Corporation must provide that no member of the board or management level employee of the board or a member of his immediate family or any business or professional services firm in which the person or a member of the person's immediate family is a director, officer, owner, partner, or holder of stock exceeding 5% of the equity at fair market value of the business shall enter into any contract valued at \$500 or more to provide goods or services to the Port Corporation or its subsidiaries unless the contract has been awarded to the lowest responsible bidder through an open and public process, including prior public notice and subsequent public disclosure of all proposals considered and contracts awarded.
- (b) Employees.—As a condition of the Commonwealth's initial and continued participation in the capital construction projects authorized under section 3(13)(xxi) for the Philadelphia Port Corporation, the policies of the Port Corporation must provide that no management level Port Corporation employee is a party officer, public official, public employee or a member of the immediate family of a party officer, public officer or public official.
- (c) Affirmative action.—The Philadelphia Port Corporation shall develop and implement an affirmative action plan to assure that all persons are accorded equality of opportunity in employment and contracting by the Philadelphia Port Corporation, its contractors, subcontractors, assignees, lessees, agents, vendors and suppliers. The Philadelphia Port Corporation, its contractors, subcontractors, assignees, lessees, agents, vendors and suppliers shall not be subject to any city laws, ordinances, rules or regulations relating to any limits or preferences with regard to employment, contracting

or procurement in the construction and operation of the Philadelphia Port Corporation, nor shall they adopt, as part of any affirmative action plan, any limits or preferences with regard to employment, contracting or procurement in the construction and operation of the Philadelphia Port Corporation.

- (d) Definitions.—"Management level employees" shall mean the President and Chief Executive Officer of the Port Corporation, the Counsel of the corporation and any corporation employee with discretionary powers which may affect the outcome of the corporation's decisions in relation to a private corporation or business or any employee who by virtue of his job function could influence the outcome of such a decision. "Party officer," "public officer," "public official," "public employee" and "immediate family" shall have the meanings given to them in section 16(e) of the act of June 27, 1986 (P.L.267, No.70), known as the Pennsylvania Convention Center Authority Act.
- (e) Limitation on Philadelphia Port projects.—No funds shall be distributed or expended relative to Philadelphia Port projects itemized in section 3(13)(xxi)(C), (D), (E), (G), (I), (J) and (L) until such time as legislation is enacted by the General Assembly that revises the method of governance of the Philadelphia Port Corporation or its successor agency.

Section 8. Use of existing funds.

Of the \$14,580,000 which is authorized for the purchase of the furniture and equipment for the projects which are included in section 4, the sum of \$1,251,000 shall be provided from excess funds available in the unallocated reserve of the Capital Facilities Fund from previous furniture and equipment appropriations.

Section 9. Heating systems.

- (a) Coal requirement.—Except as provided in subsection (b), any heating system or heating unit installed as part of any of the public improvement projects itemized in this act shall be fueled by coal.
- (b) Exception.—Whenever it appears that it might be feasible to use natural gas from wells located in Pennsylvania or wood from forests located in Pennsylvania, the Secretary of General Services shall compare the cost effectiveness of using that fuel to the cost effectiveness of using coal and shall use the fuel which he determines to be the most cost effective.
- (c) Exemption.—Any heating system or heating unit shall be exempt from the requirement of subsection (a) if the Department of General Services determines that:
 - (1) the application of subsection (a) to that heating system or heating unit would violate existing or reasonably anticipated environmental laws or regulations;
 - (2) using coal as the fuel for that heating system or heating unit would not be cost effective when compared to using other forms of energy;
 - (3) using natural gas from wells located in Pennsylvania or wood from forests located in Pennsylvania as the fuel for that heating system or heating unit would be cost effective when compared to using eoal; or

- (4) the heating system or heating unit would be part of a cogeneration system which would use natural gas and which was in or beyond the design stage prior to the effective date of this act.
- (d) Reports to the General Assembly.—The Department of General Services shall report to the House and Senate Appropriations Committees the basis for any determination that a heating system or heating unit shall be exempt from the requirement of subsection (a).
- (e) Section not applicable.—This section shall not apply to any public improvement project itemized in this act if the fuel to be used in that project is specified in this act.
- (f) Mixture with natural gas.—For the purposes of this section, the phrase "mixture derived, in whole or in part, from coal" includes, but is not limited to, both the intermittent and the simultaneous burning of natural gas with coal or a coal derivative if the intermittent or simultaneous burning of natural gas would:
 - (1) lower the cost of using coal or a coal derivative produced from mines in Pennsylvania; or
 - (2) enable coal or a coal derivative produced from mines in Pennsylvania to be burned in compliance with present and reasonably anticipated environmental laws and regulations.
- (g) Definition.—For the purposes of this section, the term "coal" includes coal, a synthetic derived, in whole or in part, from coal, or a mixture which includes coal or is derived, in whole or in part, from coal. Section 10. Debt authorization.
- (a) Public improvements.—The Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow, from time to time, in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$1,604,230,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the acquisition and construction of the public improvement projects specifically itemized in a capital budget.
- (b) Furniture and equipment.—The Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow, from time to time, in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$22,677,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the public improvement projects consisting of the acquisition of original movable furniture and equipment specifically itemized in a capital budget.
- (c) Transportation assistance.—The Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow, from time to time, in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$226,583,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the acquisition and construction of the transportation assistance projects specifically itemized in a capital budget.

(d) Redevelopment assistance.—Subject to the limitation in section 1616.1-B(b) of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known as The Fiscal Code, the Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow, from time to time, in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$563,598,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the redevelopment assistance projects specifically itemized in a capital budget.

Section 11. Issue of bonds.

The indebtedness authorized in this act shall be incurred, from time to time, and shall be evidenced by one or more series of general obligation bonds of the Commonwealth in such aggregate principal amount for each series as the Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer shall determine, but the latest stated maturity date shall not exceed the estimated useful life of the projects being financed as stated in section 12.

Section 12. Estimated useful life and term of debt.

- (a) Estimated useful life.—The General Assembly states that the estimated useful life of the public improvement projects itemized in this act is as follows:
 - (1) Public improvement projects, 30 years.
 - (2) Furniture and equipment projects, 10 years.
 - (3) Transportation assistance projects:
 - (i) Rolling stock, 15 years.
 - (ii) Passenger buses, 12 years.
 - (iii) Furniture and equipment, 10 years.
 - (iv) All others, 30 years.
- (b) Term of debt.—The maximum term of the debt authorized to be incurred under this act is 30 years.

 Section 13. Appropriations.
- (a) Public improvements.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of General Services in the maximum amount of \$1,604,230,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the public improvement projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of General Services the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.
- (b) Furniture and equipment.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of General Services in the maximum amount of \$22,677,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the public improvement projects consisting of the acquisition of original movable furniture and equipment specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of General Services the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

(c) Transportation assistance.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of Transportation in the maximum amount of \$226,583,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the transportation assistance projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of Transportation the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

(d) Redevelopment assistance.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of Community Affairs in the maximum amount of \$563,598,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the redevelopment assistance projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of Community Affairs the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable. Section 14. Federal funds.

In addition to those funds appropriated in section 13, all moneys received from the Federal Government for the projects specifically itemized in this act are also hereby appropriated for those projects.

Section 15. Repeals.

Sections 3(3)(xii)(A) and 8(2)(iii), (iv), (vii)(B), (xi)(B) and (xii)(C), (E), (G) and (O) and (15)(ii)(A) of the act of July 10, 1986 (P.L.1285, No.118), known as the Capital Budget Project Itemization Act for 1984-1985, are repealed.

Section 16. Editorial changes.

In editing and preparing this act for printing following the final enactment, the Legislative Reference Bureau shall insert or revise letters or numbers for projects where the letters or numbers are missing or require revision. The bureau shall also revise the total monetary amounts for the total authorization, debt authorization, appropriations and departmental totals as necessary to agree with the total monetary amounts of the projects.

Section 17. Effective date.

This act shall take effect July 1, 1987, or immediately, whichever is later.
