SB 910

Amending the act of October 21, 1988 (P.L.851, No.113), entitled, "A supplement to the act of July 3, 1987 (P.L.190, No.26), entitled 'An act providing for the capital budget for the fiscal year 1987-1988,' itemizing public improvement projects, furniture and equipment projects, transportation assistance projects and flood control projects to be constructed or acquired or assisted by the Department of General Services, the Department of Transportation or the Department of Environmental Resources, together with their estimated financial costs; authorizing the incurring of debt without the approval of the electors for the purpose of financing the projects to be constructed or acquired or assisted by the Department of General Services, the Department of Transportation or the Department of Environmental Resources; stating the estimated useful life of the projects; making appropriations; and making a repeal," adding projects; further providing for certain highway projects; moving certain projects to the correct categories; and making repeals.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The title of the act of October 21, 1988 (P.L.851, No.113), known as the Capital Budget Project Itemization Act for 1987-1988, is amended to read:

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act of July 3, 1987 (P.L.190, No.26), entitled 'An act providing for the capital budget for the fiscal year 1987-1988,' itemizing public improvement projects, furniture and equipment projects, transportation assistance projects and [flood control] redevelopment assistance projects to be constructed or acquired or assisted by the Department of General Services, the Department of Transportation or the Department of [Environmental Resources] Community Affairs, itemizing public highway projects to be constructed by the Department of Transportation from current revenues, together with their estimated financial costs; authorizing the incurring of debt without the approval of the electors for the purpose of financing the projects to be constructed or acquired or assisted by the Department of General Services, the Department of Transportation or the Department of [Environmental Resources] Community Affairs; stating the estimated useful life of the projects; making appropriations; and making a repeal.

Section 2. Section 2 of the act is amended to read:

Section 2. Total authorizations.

(a) Public improvements.—The total authorization for the additional capital projects in the category of public improvement projects itemized in section 3 and to be acquired or constructed by the Department of General Services, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt, shall be [\$1,604,230,000] \$1,622,785,000.

- (b) Furniture and equipment.—The total authorization for the additional capital projects in the category of public improvement projects consisting of the acquisition of original movable furniture and equipment to complete public improvement projects itemized in section 4 and to be purchased by the Department of General Services, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt, shall be [\$22,677,000] \$31,286,000.
- (c) Transportation assistance.—The total authorization for the capital projects in the category of transportation assistance projects itemized in section 5 with respect to which an interest is to be acquired in or constructed by the Department of Transportation, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt, shall be [\$226,583,000] \$273,833,000.
- (d) Redevelopment assistance.—The total authorization for the capital projects in the category of redevelopment assistance projects itemized in section 6 for capital grants by the Department of Community Affairs, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt, shall be [\$563,598,000.] \$559,598,000.
- (e) Public highway projects.—The total authorization for the capital projects in the category of highway projects itemized in section 6.1 and to be constructed by the Department of Transportation, its successors or assigns, and to be financed from current revenues of the Motor License Fund, shall be \$27,845,000.

Section 3. The heading of section 3(2), section 3(2) (vi)(A), the heading of section 3(3), section 3 (3)(v)(A)(X), (XI), (XII), (XIII), (XIV), (XV) and (XVI) and (B)(II), the heading of section 3(5) and section 3(5)(lxxx)(C), (cxxiv), (cliv), and (clvii)(B), the heading of section 3(8), section 3(10)(vii)(D), the heading of section 3(13) and section 3 (13)(iv) of the act are amended and the section is amended by adding projects to read: Section 3. Itemization of public improvement projects.

- (a) Public improvements.—The Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow, from time to time, in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of [\$1,604,230,000] \$1,622,785,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the acquisition and construction of the public improvement projects specifically itemized in a capital budget.
- (b) Furniture and equipment.—The Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow, from time to time, in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of [\$22,677,000] \$31,286,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the public improvement projects consisting of the acquisition of original movable furniture and equipment specifically itemized in a capital budget.

- (d) Redevelopment assistance.—Subject to the limitation in section 1616.1-B(b) of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known as The Fiscal Code, the Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow, from time to time, in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of [\$563,598,000]

\$559,598,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the redevelopment assistance projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. Section 13. Appropriations.

- (a) Public improvements.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of General Services in the maximum amount of [\$1,604,230,000] \$1,622,785,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the public improvement projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of General Services the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.
- (b) Furniture and equipment.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of General Services in the maximum amount of [\$22,677,000] \$31,286,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the public improvement projects consisting of the acquisition of original movable furniture and equipment specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of Transportation the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.
- (d) Redevelopment assistance.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of Community Affairs in the maximum amount of [\$563,598,000] \$559,598,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the redevelopment assistance projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of Community Affairs the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

Section 9. The act is amended by adding a section to read:

Section 14.1. Allocation of funds.

Whenever as determined by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation that the full estimated financial costs of the projects itemized in section 6.1 are not necessary for the proper design, acquisition or construction of such projects, the excess funds no longer required may be allocated by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation to increase the estimated costs of any one or more of the projects specifically itemized in a capital budget.

Section 10. Section 15 of the act is amended to read: Section 15. Repeals.

The following acts or parts of acts are repealed:

- (1) Section 2(5)(xivii) of the act of May 18, 1984 (P.L.263, No.62), entitled "A supplement to the act of December 20, 1983 (P.L.288, No.76), entitled "An act providing for the capital budget for the fiscal year 1983-1984," itemizing public improvement projects, furniture and equipment projects, redevelopment assistance projects and transportation assistance projects to be constructed or acquired or assisted by the Department of General Services, the Department of Transportation, the Department of Community Affairs or the Pennsylvania Fish Commission, together with their estimated financial cost; authorizing the incurring of debt without the approval of the electors for the purpose of financing the projects to be constructed or acquired or assisted by the Department of General Services, the Department of Transportation or the Department of Community Affairs; stating the estimated useful life of the projects; authorizing issuing officials to undertake limited temporary borrowing through negotiated settlements; and making an appropriation."
- (2) Section 2(37)(i) of the act of October 10, 1984 (P.L.758, No.160), entitled "An act providing for the adoption of capital projects to be financed from the current revenues of the Motor License Fund."
- (3) Sections 3(3)(xii)(A) and 8(2)(iii), (iv), (vii)(B), (xi)(B) and (xii)(C), (E), (G) and (O) and (15)(ii)(A) of the act of July 10, 1986 (P.L.1285, No.118), known as the Capital Budget Project Itemization Act for 1984-1985[, are repealed].

Section 11. This act shall take effect immediately.
