The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

PART I

GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 101. Short title.—This act shall be known and may be cited as the General Appropriation Act of 1989.

Section 102. Definitions.—The following words and phrases when used in this act shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

"Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists, engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries, auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians, marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and other assistants in any department, board or commission.

"Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies, traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, telephones and telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and notices, public advertising by or through any medium, fuel, light, heat, power and water, minor construction and renovation, repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on workmen's compensation, insurance premiums on policies of liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside hospital: Provided, That in no case shall the State institution pay more for patient care than that provided under the State medical assistance program.

Section 104. State appropriations.—(a) General Fund.—

(1) The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the General Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services, printing, public advertising by or through any medium, equipment, land and buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1989, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1989.

(2) The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the General Fund for the Pennsylvania Drug and Alcohol Abuse Initiative in Part III to the hereinafter named agencies of the Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1989.

(b) Lottery Fund.—The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Lottery Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1989, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1989.

(c) Pennsylvania Economic Revitalization Fund.—The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Pennsylvania Economic Revitalization Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1989, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1989.

(d) Energy Conservation and Assistance Fund.—The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Energy Conservation and Assistance Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1989, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1989.

(e) Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account.—The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the restricted receipt account established within the General Fund, known as the Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account, to the Judicial Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1989, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1989.

(f) Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund.—The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1989, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1989.

(g) State Stores Fund.—The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the State Stores Fund to the hereinafter named agency of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1989, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1989.

(h) Motor License Fund.—The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1989, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1989.

(i) Aviation Restricted Revenue Account.—The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the Aviation Restricted Revenue Account in the Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Commonwealth for the purposes set forth herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1989, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1989.

Section 105. Federal augmentation appropriations.—The following Federal augmentation appropriations set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying out the programs stated herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1989, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1989. Unless otherwise stated, the appropriations include any carryovers from the prior fiscal year.

Section 106. Job Training Partnership Act appropriations.—The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA) funds to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying out the program stated herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1989.

Section 107. Block grants.—(a) Appropriation.—The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the block grant (BG) funds to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the purposes, and under the restrictions, for which the funds are provided for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1989.

(b) Small Communities Development Block Grant.—The Small Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small cities and communities that have a high concentration of impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their low and moderate income housing opportunities and to meet community development needs. (c) Community Services Block Grant.—The Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to assure proper consideration of each recipient.

(d) Education Consolidation and Improvement Block Grant.—The Education Consolidation and Improvement Block Grant (ECIBG) will be used for the administration and provision of education programs in accordance with the requirements of the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act-of 1981.

(e) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant.—The Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is for the provision of preventive health and other health services related to emergency medical comprehensive public health, hypertension, fluoridation, health education, risk reduction, home health, rape crisis and rodent control.

(f) Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant.—The Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to assure mothers and children access to quality maternal and child health services, to reduce infant mortality and the incidence of preventable disease and handicapping conditions among children, to provide rehabilitative services for blind and disabled individuals under the age of 16 receiving Supplemental Security Income benefits and to provide medical services for children with crippling conditions.

(g) Alcohol and Drug Abuse and Mental Health Services Block Grant.— The Alcohol and Drug Abuse and Mental Health Services Block Grant (ADAMHSBG) will be used for the administration and provision of drug and alcohol abuse services and community mental health services in accordance with the requirements of the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981.

(h) Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant.—The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income families and individuals.

(i) Social Services Block Grant.—The Social Services Block Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible persons.

In making allocations and payments hereunder, the Court Administrator of Pennsylvania shall exclude all costs which are not properly reportable under the heading herein above specified.

Section 1103. Department of Community Affairs.—The following restricted receipt account may be established for the Department of Community Affairs:

(1) "ARC Housing Revolving Loan Program" - To provide direct loans and grants to nonprofit corporations and public authorities for housing development and rehabilitation.

Section 1104. Department of Education.—The following restricted receipt accounts may be established for the Department of Education:

(1) "Vocational Education Programs" - To support vocational education programs, construction of area vocational education school facilities, consumer education and compensation of students in work study programs at pilot and exemplary projects in vocational education.

(2) "ECIA Title I - Exceptional and Educationally Deprived Children" -To provide special educational needs and related services for children in institutions for neglected and delinquent children, to provide financial assistance to local educational agencies in areas with high concentrations of lowincome children, to initiate, expand or improve the educational programs for the handicapped in approved private schools, State schools or institutions operated or supported by the Commonwealth and to provide migrant children with educational experiences and services related to the educational process.

(3) "Education of the Handicapped Act - Title VI" - To establish a family center demonstration program for preschool handicapped children and disseminate techniques developed, to develop a comprehensive plan for the education of the preschool handicapped and to develop and operate resource centers.

(4) "Adult Basic Education - Federal Grants" - To encourage and expand basic education programs through 12th grade for adults 16 years and over.

(5) "Education of the Handicapped Act" - To initiate, expand or improve educational programs for handicapped children.

(6) "Food Nutrition Service" - To initiate, maintain and expand nonprofit food services programs, including the school breakfast program for children, through grants-in-aid and the purchase of equipment.

(7) "Library Services and Construction Act - Titles I, II and III - Library Expansion Services" - For matching payments to local libraries and for expanding library services.

(8) "Library Services and Construction Act - Jobs Bill" - To provide funds to carry out renovation and construction projects.

(9) "Penn State University Federal Aid" - For payment of Federal aid to land-grant colleges.

(10) "Transition Program for Refugee Children" - To provide special educational services to eligible refugee children.

(11) "Emergency Immigration Education Assistance" - To provide financial assistance for educational services for immigrant children.

(12) "Mathematics and Science Teacher Training/Retraining Program" - To provide a program to improve skills of teachers in mathematics, science, foreign language and computer learning.

(13) "Removal of Architectural Barriers" - To fund removal of architectural barriers to handicapped students.

(14) "Education of the Handicapped - Part D" - For training personnel for the education of the handicapped.

(15) "Byrd Scholarships" - For the Robert C. Byrd Honors Scholarship program to promote student excellence and achievement and to recognize exceptionally able students who show promise of continued excellence.

(16) "Migrant Education Clearing House."

(17) "Homeless Adult Assistance Program."

(18) "United States Department of Education" - For the education of the handicapped-pre-school.

Section 1105. Department of Environmental Resources.—The following restricted receipt accounts may be established for the Department of Environmental Resources:

(1) "Federal Water Resources Planning Act" - To be used for conservation, development and utilization of water and related land resources, including, but not limited to, development of a State Water Plan, increasing State participation in such planning and participation in river basin commissions.

(2) "Federal Aid to Volunteer Fire Companies" - For deposit of Federal funds received in accordance with Title IV of the Rural Development Act of 1972.

(3) "Federal Land and Water Conservation Fund Act" - For deposit of Federal funds received from the Heritage Conservation and Recreation Services for outdoor recreation. (4) "National Forest Reserve Allotment" - For payment of funds to those counties in which national forests are located.

(5) "Flood Control Payments" - To be used to defray county expenses.

(6) "Federal Land and Water Conservation Fund Act - Environmental Resources."

(7) "Soil and Water Conservation Act - Inventory of Programs" - To provide assistance through the states to local soil and water conservation districts to develop an inventory of long-term soil and water resources programs conducted under the United States Department of Agriculture.

Section 1106. Department of Transportation.—The following restricted receipt accounts may be established for the Department of Transportation:

(1) "Capital Assistance Elderly and Handicapped Programs."

(2) "Railroad Rehabilitation and Improvement Assistance."

(3) "Ridesharing/Van Pool Program - Acquisition."

Section 1107. Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency.—The following restricted receipt accounts may be established for the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency:

(b) Lottery Fund.—The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Lottery Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1988, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1988.

(c) Motor License Fund.—The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1988, and for the payment of bill incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1988.

Section 1203. Federal augmentation appropriations.—The following Federal augmentation appropriations set forth in this part, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying out the programs stated herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1988, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1988. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to assure proper consideration of each recipient.

(d) Education Consolidation and Improvement Block Grant.—The Education Consolidation and Improvement Block Grant (ECIBG) will be used for the administration and provision of education programs in accordance with the requirements of the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981.

(e) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant.—The Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is for the provision of preventive health and other health services related to emergency medical comprehensive public health, hypertension, fluoridation, health education, risk reduction, home health, rape crisis and rodent control.

(f) Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant.—The Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to assure mothers and children access to quality maternal and child health services, to reduce infant mortality and the incidence of preventable disease and handicapping conditions among children, to provide rehabilitative services for blind and disabled individuals under the age of 16 receiving Supplemental Security Income benefits and to provide medical services for children with crippling conditions.

(g) Alcohol and Drug Abuse and Mental Health Services Block Grant.— The Alcohol and Drug Abuse and Mental Health Services Block Grant (ADAMHSBG) will be used for the administration and provision of drug and alcohol abuse services and community mental health services in accordance with the requirements of the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981.

(h) Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant.—The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income families and individuals.

(i) Social Services Block Grant.—The Social Services Block Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible persons.

SUBPART E MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Section 1261. Prior laws unaffected.—This part is not intended to be inconsistent with or to repeal any provision of any act enacted at this or any prior session of the General Assembly regulating the purchase of supplies, the ordering of printing and binding, the purchase, maintenance and use of automobiles, the method of making payments from the State Treasury for any purpose or the functioning of any administrative department, board or commission.

Section 1262. Compliance with other law before funds available.—No appropriation made by this part to any department, board, commission or agency of the Executive Department shall be available unless and until the department, board, commission or agency has complied with sections 615 and 616 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929.

Section 1263. Contracts prerequisite to encumbering or committing funds.—Funds for the purchase of supplies, materials and equipment shall not be deemed to be committed or encumbered until contracts covering the purchase have been entered into with the vendors.

Section 1264. Minority business set-asides.—(a) Each department or other instrumentality of the Commonwealth listed in Subpart B, authorized

to contract for buildings, highways, commodities, equipment, supplies or services, shall report to the General Assembly all information pertinent to anticipated procurement needs at the beginning of each fiscal year and each fiscal quarter thereafter.

(b) As used in this section, the term "minority business" means a minority business enterprise as defined in the act of July 22, 1974 (P.L.598, No.206), known as the Pennsylvania Minority Business Development Authority Act.

Section 1265. Appropriation of funds from miscellaneous sources.— (a) In addition to the amounts appropriated by this part, moneys received in payment for food and household supplies furnished to employees and other persons, except inmates, by an institution, and moneys received from the proceeds from the sale of any products of the soil, meats, livestock, timber or other materials sold by the department shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund to the several respective institutions for the operation and maintenance of the institutions.

(b) In addition to the amounts appropriated by this part, all moneys received from any other source, except the Federal Government, as contributions for the programs provided herein or as payment for services or materials furnished by one institution to another, except those collections designated as revenues, shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund for the purposes of the respective appropriations.

(c) In addition to any funds specifically appropriated by this part, all moneys received by a department or agency of the Commonwealth from any other sources, except the Federal Government, as contributions or supplements to the department or agency for a program or administration of an act included in this part shall be paid into the General Fund and credited to the appropriation for that program or administration of the act.

Section 1266. Distributions from other appropriations.—Any moneys distributed from the appropriation for increased costs resulting from a cost-of-living increase provided to annuitants in section 235 of the act of June 29, 1988 (P.L.1956, No.5A), known as the General Appropriation Act of 1988, and the appropriation for increased costs of employees' salaries, wages and benefits in section 228 of the act of October 14, 1988 (P.L.2175, No.55A), known as the First Supplemental Appropriation Act to the General Appropriation Act of 1988, shall be in addition to the moneys provided in this act.

Section 1267. Lapsing of unused funds.—(a) Except as otherwise provided by law or in subsections (b) and (c), that part of all appropriations in Subparts B and C unexpended, uncommitted or unencumbered as of June 30, 1989, shall automatically lapse as of that date.

(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 1106(a) of the act of June 29, 1988 (P.L.1956, No.5A), known as the General Appropriation Act of 1988, the appropriation in Part IV of that act to the Department of Agriculture for the Capital Loan Fund for Class IV loans to agricultural processors shall be a two-year continuing appropriation.

Construction with prior appropriation acts.—Any appropriation in Subparts B and C of this part which is the same as or similar to an appropriation in the act of June 29, 1988 (P.L.1956, No.5A), known as the General Appropriation Act of 1988, the act of October 14, 1988 (P.L.2175, No.55A), known as the First Supplemental Appropriation Act to the General Appropriation Act of 1988, or the act of July 12, 1988 (P.L.2111, No.13A), entitled "An act itemizing appropriations required from the Motor License Fund and the State Stores Fund for the fiscal year July 1, 1988, to June 30, 1989, for the proper operation of the several departments of the Common-wealth and the Pennsylvania State Police authorized to spend Motor License Fund and the State Stores Fund moneys," shall replace that appropriation.

Section 1269. Deduction of expended appropriations under prior law.— Any money that has been appropriated and expended under the act of June 29, 1988 (P.L.1956, No.5A), known as the General Appropriation Act of 1988, the act of October 14, 1988 (P.L.2175, No.55A), known as the First Supplemental Appropriation Act to the General Appropriation Act of 1988, or the act of July 12, 1988 (P.L.2111, No.13A), entitled, "An act itemizing appropriations required from the Motor License Fund and the State Stores Fund for the fiscal year July 1, 1988, to June 30, 1989, for the proper operation of the several departments of the Commonwealth and the Pennsylvania State Police authorized to spend Motor License Fund and the State Stores Fund moneys," shall be deducted from the corresponding appropriation in this part.

PART XIII

SPECIAL PROVISIONS FOR FEDERAL FUNDS

Section 1301. General Fund repository for Federal funds.—All moneys received from the Federal Government as contributions or supplements to the departments or agencies of the Commonwealth or the programs herein provided shall be paid into the General Fund.

Section 1302. Limitation on encumbering or spending Federal funds.— Federal funds shall be encumbered or spent only to the extent that such funds are estimated as being available during the fiscal year of the Commonwealth.

Section 1303. Appropriation of prior unspent Federal funds.—Any Federal money which has been previously appropriated by the General Assembly and authorized or allocated by the Federal Government but remains unspent from prior fiscal years, and will not be renewed for fiscal year 1989-1990, is hereby appropriated.

Section 1304. Subgrants between Federal fund appropriations.—With the exception of Federal money received under JTPA and SSBG, subgrants may be made between appropriations without further approval of the General Assembly. The Secretary of the Budget shall submit a list of subgrants to the Chairmen of the House and Senate Appropriations Committees quarterly. No subgrant to a State agency, however, may be made from a restricted receipt account without a specific appropriation by the General Assembly.

Section 1305. Utilization of emergency Federal funds.—(a) Federal funds available for costs and damages resulting from natural disasters or civil disobedience may be added to an appropriation contained in this act or to funds appropriated or may be used for the purposes prescribed by the Federal Government.

(b) In addition to the moneys appropriated by this act, all moneys received from the Federal Government for the purpose of disaster assistance or relief shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund to the departments, boards, commissions or agencies designated by the Governor.

(c) In the event of any emergency situation in which the General Assembly cannot act in sufficient time, the Governor is authorized through executive authorization to provide up to \$5,000,000 in Federal funds to alleviate the emergency situation. For the purposes of this section, "emergency" is defined as any situation in which there is a chance of, or which may result in, substantial human suffering.

PART XIV

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Section 1401. Prior laws unaffected.—This act is not intended to be inconsistent with or to repeal any provision of any act enacted at this or any prior session of the General Assembly regulating the purchase of supplies, the ordering of printing and binding, the purchase, maintenance and use of automobiles, the method of making payments from the State Treasury for any purpose or the functioning of any administrative department, board or commission.

Section 1402. Compliance with other law before funds available.—No appropriation made by this act to any department, board, commission or agency of the Executive Department shall be available unless and until the department, board, commission or agency has complied with sections 615 and 616 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929.

Section 1403. Contracts prerequisite to encumbering or committing funds.—Funds for the purchase of supplies, materials and equipment shall not be deemed to be committed or encumbered until contracts covering the purchase have been entered into with the vendors.

Section 1404. Minority business set-asides.—(a) Each department or other instrumentality of the Commonwealth listed in Subpart A of Part II, authorized to contract for buildings, highways, commodities, equipment, supplies or services, shall report to the General Assembly all information pertinent to anticipated procurement needs at the beginning of each fiscal year and each fiscal quarter thereafter.

(b) As used in this section, the term "minority business" means a minority business enterprise as defined in the act of July 22, 1974 (P.L.598, No.206), known as the Pennsylvania Minority Business Development Authority Act.

Section 1405. Appropriation of funds from miscellaneous sources.— (a) In addition to the amounts appropriated by this act, moneys received in payment for food and household supplies furnished to employees and other persons, except inmates, by an institution, and moneys received from the proceeds from the sale of any products of the soil, meats, livestock, timber or other materials sold by the department shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund to the several respective institutions for the operation and maintenance of the institutions.

(b) In addition to the amounts appropriated by this act, all moneys received from any other source, except the Federal Government, as contributions for the programs provided herein or as payment for services or materials furnished by one institution to another, except those collections designated as revenues, shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund for the purposes of the respective appropriations.

(c) In addition to any funds specifically appropriated by this act, all moneys received by a department or agency of the Commonwealth from any other sources, except the Federal Government, as contributions or supplements to the department or agency for a program or administration of an act included in this act shall be paid into the General Fund and credited to the appropriation for that program or administration of the act.

Section 1406. Lapsing of unused funds.—(a) Except as otherwise provided by law or in subsections (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g), (h), (i), (j), (k) and (l), that part of all appropriations in Parts II, III, IV, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX and X unexpended, uncommitted or unencumbered as of June 30, 1990, shall automatically lapse as of that date.

(b) (1) The appropriation in Part II to the Department of Community Affairs for housing and redevelopment assistance shall be a two-year continuing appropriation.

(2) The appropriation in Part II to the Department of Community Affairs for enterprise development shall be a two-year continuing appropriation.

(c) The appropriations in Part II to the Department of Environmental Resources for the Chesapeake Bay Pollution Abatement Program and the black fly control program shall be continuing appropriations.

(d) The appropriation in Part II to the Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency for loan forgiveness shall be a two-year continuing appropriation.

(e) The appropriations in Part II to the Legislative Department shall be continuing appropriations.

(f) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2), all appropriations in Part III shall be two-year continuing appropriations.

(2) The following appropriations in Part III which are unexpended, uncommitted or unencumbered as of June 30, 1990, shall automatically lapse as of that date:

(i) The appropriation for AIDS programs in section 305.

(ii) The appropriation for children and youth programs, family preservation, transitional housing for the homeless and domestic violence programs in section 306.

(iii) The appropriation for mobile narcotics teams in section 307.

(iv) The appropriation for the Drug Offenders Work Program in section 308.

(g) The appropriation in Part V to the Department of Community Affairs for the Recreation Improvement and Rehabilitation Act shall be a two-year continuing appropriation.

(h) The appropriation in Part V to the Department of Environmental Resources for the Pennsylvania Conservation Corps shall be a two-year continuing appropriation.

(i) The appropriations in Part V to the Department of Commerce for business infrastructure development and industrial resource centers shall be two-year continuing appropriations.

(j) The appropriation in Part VI to the Pennsylvania Energy Office shall be a two-year continuing appropriation.

(k) The appropriations in section 1021 of Part X for airport development, runway rehabilitation, business airport grants and real estate tax rebate payments shall be two-year continuing appropriations.

(1) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 1008(a) of the act of July 3, 1987 (P.L.459, No.9A), known as the General Appropriation Act of 1987, the appropriation in Part IV of that act to the Department of Commerce for the engineering school equipment shall be a three-year continuing appropriation.

PART XV

EFFECTIVE DATE

Section 1501. Effective date.—This act shall take effect as follows:

(1) Part XII of this act shall take effect immediately and shall be retroactive to June 30, 1989.

(2) The remainder of this act shall take effect July 1, 1989, or immediately, whichever is later.
