## AN ACT

SB 1547

**Making appropriations from the Professional Licensure Augmentation Account and from restricted revenue accounts within the General Fund to the Department of State for use by the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs in support of the professional licensure boards assigned thereto.**

**The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:**

**Section 1. The sum of \$11,858,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Professional Licensure Augmentation Account within the General Fund to the Department of State for the operation of the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs, including the State Board of Auctioneer Examiners, for the fiscal year July 1, 1990, to June 30, 1991.**

**Section 2. (a) The sum of \$1,600,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the restricted receipts account of the State Board of Medicine, as authorized by section 907(a) of the act of October 15, 1975 (P.L.390, No.111), known as the Health Care Services Malpractice Act, for the operation of said board for the fiscal year July 1, 1990, to June 30, 1991.**

**(b) The sum of \$417,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the restricted receipts account of the State Board of Osteopathic Medicine, as authorized by section 907(b) of the Health Care Services Malpractice Act, for the operation of said board for the fiscal year July 1, 1990, to June 30, 1991.**

**(c) The sum of \$120,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the restricted receipts account of the State Board of Podiatry, as authorized by section 907(c) of the Health Care Services Malpractice Act, for the operation of said board for the fiscal year July 1, 1990, to June 30, 1991.**

**(d) The sum of \$292,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Athletic Commission Augmentation Account for the State Athletic Commission, as authorized by section 3106 of the act of July 1, 1989 (P.L.136, No.28), known as the Athletic Code, for the support and operation of said commission for the fiscal year July 1, 1990, to June 30, 1991.**

**(e) Each appropriation listed in subsections (a), (b), (c) and (d) shall not be treated as an augmentation to the Department of State, general government appropriation, or any other appropriation, but shall be treated and accounted for as separate appropriations respectively.**

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1990, or immediately, whichever is later.

HB 2312

Making appropriations from a restricted revenue account within the General Fund and from Federal augmentation funds to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are specifically appropriated from the restricted revenue account within the General Fund and from Federal augmentation funds to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission to provide for the operation of the commission for the fiscal year July 1, 1990, to June 30, 1991, for the purposes and in the amounts shown:

(1) For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the proper operation and administration of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, excluding the chairman and commissioners and the Bureau of Safety and Enforcement.		

State appropriation.....		\$26,252,000
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(i) The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are specifically appropriated to supplement the sum authorized to be billed to utilities for the operation of the commission:

(A) "Natural Gas Pipeline Safety" - To enforce the regulations of the Natural Gas Pipeline Safety Act.

Federal appropriation.....	115,000
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Any Federal funds which the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission receives pursuant to these appropriations shall not be credited to any utility nor used to lower the annual assessment of any utility.

For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the chairman and the commissioners.

State appropriation.....	411,000
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For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the proper operation and administration of the Bureau of Safety and Enforcement.

State appropriation..... 4,613,000

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1990, or immediately, whichever is later.

Section 1. The sum of \$3,173,000 is hereby appropriated from the restricted revenue account within the General Fund to the Office of Consumer Advocate to provide for the operation of that office for the fiscal year July 1, 1990, to June 30, 1991.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1990, or immediately, whichever is later.

## HB 2458

**Making appropriations from the Workmen's Compensation Administration Fund to the Department of Labor and Industry to provide for the expenses of administering The Pennsylvania Workmen's Compensation Act and The Pennsylvania Occupational Disease Act for the fiscal year July 1, 1990, to June 30, 1991, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1990.**

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$19,789,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Workmen's Compensation Administration Fund to the Department of Labor and Industry for the payment of all salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the administration of the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known as The Pennsylvania Workmen's Compensation Act, and the act of June 21, 1939 (P.L.566, No.284), known as The Pennsylvania Occupational Disease Act, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1990, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1990.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1990, or immediately, whichever is later.

HB 2571

Appropriating money from the Sunny Day Fund to the Department of Commerce for various projects throughout this Commonwealth for fiscal year 1990-1991.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Sunny Day Fund to the Department of Commerce for the fiscal year July 1, 1990, to June 30, 1991, for projects listed to enhance economic development and the creation of jobs in this Commonwealth in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 1 of the act of July 1, 1985 (P.L.120, No.32), known as the Sunny Day Fund Act.

Section 2. The following amounts are appropriated to the Department of Commerce to induce companies to locate large industrial, manufacturing or research and development enterprises within this Commonwealth:

- (1) For the purpose of making a loan to Centocor, Inc., to renovate and expand its pharmaceutical manufacturing facility in Malvern, Chester County. It is estimated that this project will create 1,000 new jobs within three years of operation. \$8,500,000
- (2) For the purpose of making a loan to Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, to establish a research and development center focusing on pediatric medicine, molecular biology, cell biology, cancer, neurology, immunobiology and hematology, among others, and state-of-the-art health care specialties in children's health. It is estimated that this project will create 600 new jobs within three years of operation. 9,000,000
- (3) For the purpose of making a loan to Enzymatics, Inc., to purchase machinery and equipment for its manufacturing facility located in Montgomery County. It is estimated that this project will create 332 new jobs within three years of operation. 3,000,000
- (4) For the purpose of making a loan to Ambridge Marine, Inc., to establish a manufacturing facility in Ambridge Borough, Beaver County. It is estimated that this project will create 350 new jobs within three years of operation. 2,500,000
- (5) For the purpose of making a loan to Sony Corporation of America, to establish a manufacturing facility in

Westmoreland County. It is estimated that the project will create 1,000 new jobs within three years of operation.

(6) For the purpose of making a loan to the May Department Stores Company, to establish a regional distribution facility in Wilkes-Barre, Luzerne County. It is estimated that the project will create 350 new jobs within three years of operation.

Section 3. It is the intent of the General Assembly that the appropriations in section 2 shall be loaned at an annual interest rate that in no case shall be less than the Pennsylvania Industrial Development Authority's rate for the area in which the project is located and for a term that shall be no greater than the term for an equivalent Pennsylvania Industrial Development Authority project. Private companies which receive Sunny Day Fund assistance but fail to make the investment in the enterprise development as specified in section 2 shall be liable for the repayment of all Sunny Day Fund moneys, including any accrued interest thereon and any penalties as provided in the loan documents or as may be set by the Secretary of Commerce. Private companies which receive Sunny Day Fund assistance but fail to create the number of jobs specified in the approved loan or other agreements with the Commonwealth shall be liable for a penalty equal to an increase in the interest charged to 2% greater than the current prime interest rate for the remainder of the loan, unless the penalty is waived by the Secretary of Commerce because the failure is due to circumstances outside the control of the private company. The prime interest rate shall be the highest rate known or declared to be prime by those banking institutions located within this Commonwealth with assets in excess of \$3,000,000,000 as of the date the penalty is assessed. The Secretary of Commerce shall consult with the chairmen of the Appropriations Committees of the Senate and the House of Representatives prior to the establishment of waiver of penalties.

Section 4. For a period equal to the term of assistance provided each project approved under this act, the Department of Commerce shall provide a written report on the status of each project to the Secretary of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives by June 30 of each year. This report shall contain, at a minimum, information pertaining to the specific use of the Sunny Day Fund money, the interest rate and term of the Sunny Day Fund loan, the amount of principal outstanding and interest due on the loan and the number of jobs created by the project. All recipients of funds under this act shall be required to provide any and all information required by the Department of Commerce for the purpose of this act.

Section 5. No funds under this act shall be awarded by the Department of Commerce after June 30, 1991. Any funds from this appropriation remaining unexpended or unencumbered on June 30, 1992, shall automatically lapse into the Sunny Day Fund.



Section 6. This act shall take effect immediately.

A Supplement

HB 2515

To the act of April 1, 1863 (P.L.213, No.227), entitled "An act to accept the grant of Public Lands, by the United States, to the several states, for the endowment of Agricultural Colleges," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect; providing for a basis for payments of such appropriations; and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. In order to carry into effect the act of Congress, approved July 2, 1862, granting public land to the several states for educational purposes, and subsequent acts of Congress related thereto, and the act of the General Assembly of Pennsylvania accepting the provisions and conditions of said acts of Congress and pledging the faith of the State to carry the same into effect, the following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated to the Trustees of The Pennsylvania State University for the fiscal year July 1, 1990, to June 30, 1991, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For educational and general expenses.....	\$183,129,000
(2) For medical education.....	9,413,000
(3) For the Central Pennsylvania Psychiatric Institute...	1,625,000
(4) For the cost of agricultural research.....	19,268,000
(5) For cost of agricultural extension services.....	19,729,000
(6) To enhance the recruitment and retention of disadvantaged students.....	300,000
(7) For the Pennsylvania College of Technology.....	9,287,000
(8) For debt service related to the former Williamsport Area Community College.....	884,000

Section 2. Payments to The Pennsylvania State University on account of the appropriations for all items as provided in section 1 shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Section 3. If necessary, The Pennsylvania State University may transfer funds among the appropriations listed in section 1(1), (3) and (4): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.

Section 4. (a) Payments to The Pennsylvania State University of the appropriations provided in section 1 shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.

(b) Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of section 2 on the basis of estimated costs. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by The Pennsylvania State University to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 5. Notwithstanding any provision of the General Appropriation Act of 1990 relating to the payment of retirement expenses, the Trustees of The Pennsylvania State University shall make all required payments to the State Employees' Retirement Fund from the funds appropriated pursuant to this act.

Section 6. (a) The Pennsylvania State University shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, The Pennsylvania State University shall file, with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year, as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.

(b) Such statement of expenditures and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by The Pennsylvania State University to the State Treasurer. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only, and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning such expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 7. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives and shall include data for all programs except the Doctor of Medicine program. The report, to be submitted prior to September 1, 1991, shall cover the 12-month period beginning with the summer term 1990 and shall include:

(1) The following counts and distributions for each term during the period:

(i) The definitions and numbers of faculty members employed full time, of faculty members employed part time, of full-time students enrolled in graduate courses, of full-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses, of part-time students enrolled in graduate courses and of part-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses.

(ii) The total numbers of undergraduate student credit hours, divided into lower division and upper division course levels, and of graduate student credit hours, divided into three course levels—master's, first professional and doctoral.

(iii) The number of different courses scheduled by level of instruction and the number of sections of individual instruction scheduled by level of instruction, each further subdivided by two-digit Classification of Instructional Program (CIP) categories of instructional programs of higher education as defined by the National Center for Education Statistics, United States Department of Education.

(iv) The number of terms scheduled and the dates thereof.

(2) For the summer term and the following academic year in total and for each two-digit CIP program category, a classification of faculty members or other professional employees by title, including: professor, associate professor, assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, research associate, librarian and academic administrator; faculty members or other professional employees under each title to be subdivided by type of assignment: teaching and non-teaching; and each such set of faculty members or other professional employees to be further subdivided by type of employment: full-time or part-time; and the following aggregates for each such subdivided classification:

(i) The number of faculty and other professional employees and their full-time equivalence in instructional and noninstructional functions.

(ii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate classroom courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate classroom courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(iii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate individual instruction courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate individual instruction courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(iv) The sum of undergraduate classroom student credit hours and the sum of graduate classroom student credit hours generated, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(v) The sum of undergraduate individual instruction student credit hours and the sum of graduate individual instruction student credit hours generated, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(vi) The total salary paid for instructional functions and for noninstructional functions and the amount of this salary paid for each of these functions from university funds, Federal funds and other funds.

(3) For each term of the period covered for each faculty member employed full time identified by two-digit CIP program category and title, the report shall contain an analysis of the average hours per week spent in university-related activities, stating specifically hours spent in undergraduate classroom contact and graduate classroom contact, hours spent in preparation, hours spent in research and hours spent in public service.

Section 8. In addition to the requirements in section 7 relative to this appropriation, the report covering the 12-month period beginning with the summer term 1990 shall include for all programs of the university:

(1) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureate degree and for a master's degree.

(2) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, first professional degrees and doctoral degrees awarded in 1988, 1989, 1990 and estimated 1991.

Section 9. The Pennsylvania State University shall provide such information as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this act and in such form and manner as the Department of Education shall prescribe.

Section 10. The Pennsylvania State University shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in the "Higher Education Finance Manual, United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare (1975)" and the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for the State System of Higher Education, State-Related Universities and Non-State-Related Colleges and Universities."

Section 11. This act shall take effect July 1, 1990, or immediately, whichever is later.

## A SUPPLEMENT

## HB 2516

To the act of July 28, 1966 (3rd Sp.Sess., P.L.87, No.3), entitled "An act providing for the establishment and operation of the University of Pittsburgh as an instrumentality of the Commonwealth to serve as a State-related university in the higher education system of the Commonwealth; providing for change of name; providing for the composition of the board of trustees; terms of trustees, and the power and duties of such trustees; authorizing appropriations in amounts to be fixed annually by the General Assembly; providing for the auditing of accounts of expenditures from said appropriations; providing for public support and capital improvements; authorizing the issuance of bonds exempt from taxation within the Commonwealth; requiring the chancellor to make an annual report of the operations of the University of Pittsburgh," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect; providing for a basis for payments of such appropriations; and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1990, to June 30, 1991, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For educational and general expenses.....	\$115,411,000
(2) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only.....	6,465,000
(3) For operation of dental clinics in the school of dentistry.....	1,067,000
(4) For operations of the Titusville Campus.....	887,000
(5) To enhance the recruitment and retention of disadvantaged students.....	300,000
(6) For operation of the Bradford Campus.....	1,205,000
(7) For general maintenance and operation of the Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic.....	7,972,000
(8) For the teen suicide center at the Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic.....	515,000

Section 2. Payments to the University of Pittsburgh on account of the appropriations for all items as provided in section 1 shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Section 3. If necessary, the University of Pittsburgh may transfer funds between the appropriations listed in section 1(1) and (2): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.

Section 4. (a) Payments to the University of Pittsburgh of the appropriations provided in section 1 shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.

(b) Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of section 2 on the basis of estimated costs. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by the University of Pittsburgh to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 5. (a) The University of Pittsburgh shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, the University of Pittsburgh shall file, with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly, the Auditor General of the Commonwealth and the chief administrator of each branch campus, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year, as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.

(b) Such statement of expenditures and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by the University of Pittsburgh to the State Treasurer. Section 6. The University of Pittsburgh shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in the "Higher Education Finance Manual, United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare (1975)" and the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for the State System of Higher Education, State-Related Universities and Non-State-Related Colleges and Universities."

Section 10. This act shall take effect July 1, 1990, or immediately, whichever is later.

To the act of November 30, 1965 (P.L.843, No.355), entitled "An act providing for the establishment and operation of Temple University as an instrumentality of the Commonwealth to serve as a State-related university in the higher education system of the Commonwealth; providing for change of name; providing for the composition of the board of trustees; terms of trustees, and the power and duties of such trustees; providing for preference to Pennsylvania residents in tuition; providing for public support and capital improvements; authorizing appropriations in amounts to be fixed annually by the General Assembly; providing for the auditing of accounts of expenditures from said appropriations; authorizing the issuance of bonds exempt from taxation within the Commonwealth; requiring the President to make an annual report of the operations of Temple University," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect; providing for a basis for payments of such appropriations; and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated to the Trustees of Temple University for the fiscal year July 1, 1990, to June 30, 1991, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For educational and general expenses.....	\$126,445,000
(2) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only.....	8,606,000
(3) For operation of dental clinics in the school of dentistry.....	1,067,000
(4) To enhance the recruitment and retention of disadvantaged students.....	300,000
(5) For maxillofacial prosthodontics.....	100,000

Section 2. Payments to Temple University on account of the appropriations for all items as provided in section 1 shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Section 3. If necessary, Temple University may transfer funds among the appropriations listed in section 1(1) and (2): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.

Section 4. (a) Payment to Temple University of the appropriations provided in section 1 shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.

(b) Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of section 2 on the basis of estimated costs. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by Temple University to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 5. (a) Temple University shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, Temple University shall file, with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year, as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.

(b) Such statement of expenditures and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by Temple University to the State Treasurer. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only, and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning said expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 6. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives and shall include data for all programs except the Doctor of Medicine program. The report, to be submitted prior to September 1, 1991, shall cover the 12-month period beginning with the summer term 1990 and shall include:

(1) The following counts and distributions for each term during the period:

(i) The definitions and numbers of faculty members employed full-time, of faculty members employed part time, of full-time students enrolled in graduate courses, of full-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses, of part-time students enrolled in graduate courses and of part-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses.

(ii) The total numbers of undergraduate student credit hours, divided into lower division and upper division course levels, and of graduate student credit hours divided into three course levels—master's, first professional and doctoral.

(iii) The number of different courses scheduled by level of instruction and the number of sections of individual instruction scheduled by level of instruction, each further subdivided by two-digit Classification of Instructional Program (CIP) categories of instructional programs of higher education as defined by the National Center for Education Statistics, United States Department of Education.

(iv) The number of terms scheduled and the dates thereof.

(2) For the summer term and the following academic year in total and for each two-digit CIP program category, a classification of faculty members or other professional employees by title, including: professor, associate professor, assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, research associate, librarian and

academic administrator; faculty members or other professional employees under each title to be subdivided by type of assignment: teaching and non-teaching; and each such set of faculty members or other professional employees to be further subdivided by type of employment: full-time or part-time; and the following aggregates for each such subdivided classification:

(i) The number of faculty and other professional employees and their full-time equivalence in instructional and noninstructional functions.

(ii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate classroom courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate classroom courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(iii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate individual instruction courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate individual instruction courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(iv) The sum of undergraduate classroom student credit hours and the sum of graduate classroom student credit hours generated, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(v) The sum of undergraduate individual instruction student credit hours and the sum of graduate individual instruction student credit hours generated, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(vi) The total salary paid for instructional functions and for noninstructional functions and the amount of this salary paid for each of these functions from university funds, Federal funds and other funds.

(3) For each term of the period covered for each faculty member employed full time identified by two-digit CIP program category and title, the report shall contain an analysis of the average hours per week spent in university-related activities, stating specifically hours spent in undergraduate classroom contact and graduate classroom contact, hours spent in preparation, hours spent in research and hours spent in public service.

Section 7. In addition to the requirements in section 6 relative to this appropriation, each report covering the 12-month period beginning with the summer term 1990 shall include for all programs of the university:

(1) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureate degree and for a master's degree.

(2) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, first professional degrees and doctoral degrees awarded in 1988, 1989, 1990 and estimated 1991.

Section 8. Temple University shall provide such information as may be necessary to carry out this act and in such form and manner as the Department of Education shall prescribe.

Section 9. Temple University shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in the "Higher Education Finance

Manual, United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare (1975)" and the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for the State System of Higher Education, State-Related Universities and Non-State-Related Colleges and Universities."

Section 10. This act shall take effect July 1, 1990, or immediately, whichever is later.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated to the Trustees of Lincoln University, Chester County, for the fiscal year July 1, 1990, to June 30, 1991, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For educational and general expenses.....	\$9,296,000
(2) To enhance the recruitment and retention of disadvantaged students.....	300,000
(3) For the International Affairs Institute.....	300,000

Section 2. Payments to Lincoln University on account of the appropriations for the items provided in section 1 shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Section 3. (a) Payments to Lincoln University of the appropriations provided in section 1 shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.

(b) Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of section 2 on the basis of estimated costs. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by Lincoln University to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 4. (a) Lincoln University shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, Lincoln University shall file, with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and costs, as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.

(b) Such statement of expenditures and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by Lincoln University to the State Treasurer. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only, and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning said expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 5. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives and shall include data for all programs. The report, to be submitted prior to September 1, 1991, shall cover the 12-month period beginning with the summer term 1990 and shall include:

Section 6. In addition to the requirements in section 5 relative to this appropriation, the report covering the 12-month period beginning with the summer term 1990 shall include for all programs of the university:

HB 2553

Making an appropriation to the Afro-American Historical and Cultural Museum for operating expenses.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$269,000 is hereby appropriated to the Afro-American Historical and Cultural Museum, Philadelphia, for the fiscal year July 1, 1990, to June 30, 1991, for operating expenses, including maintenance and the purchase of apparatus, supplies and equipment.

Section 2. Payments to the Afro-American Historical and Cultural Museum on account of the appropriation provided in section 1 shall be made quarterly by the Executive Director of the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission.

Section 3. The Afro-American Historical and Cultural Museum shall provide such information as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this act and in such form and manner as the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission shall prescribe.

Section 2. Payments to the Everhart Museum on account of the appropriation provided in section 1 shall be made quarterly by the Executive Director of the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission.

Section 3. The Everhart Museum shall provide such information as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this act and in such form and manner as the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission shall prescribe.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 1990, or immediately, whichever is later.

AN ACT

SB 516

Appropriating money from the Sunny Day Fund to the Department of Commerce for various projects throughout this Commonwealth for fiscal year 1990-1991.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Sunny Day Fund to the Department of Commerce for the fiscal year July 1, 1990, to June 30, 1991, for the projects listed to enhance economic development and the creation of jobs in this Commonwealth in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 1 of the act of July 1, 1985 (P.L.120, No.32), known as the Sunny Day Fund Act.

Section 2. The following amounts are appropriated to the Department of Commerce to induce companies to locate large industrial, manufacturing or research and development enterprises within this Commonwealth:

(1) For the purpose of making a loan to Koppel Steel Corporation for machinery and equipment for the Koppel Steel Works and Ambridge Rolling Mill facilities, formerly operated by Babcock & Wilcox, in Koppel and Ambridge, Beaver County. It is estimated that this project will create a total of 650 new jobs at the two facilities within three years of operation..... \$ 4,000,000

(2) For the purpose of making a loan for construction of or for leasehold improvements to a facility to be occupied by Consolidated Rail Corporation as a customer service center in Allegheny County. It is estimated that within three years of operation this project will create more than 800 jobs of which 400 will be new jobs... \$ 2,500,000

Section 3. It is the intent of the General Assembly that the appropriations in section 2 shall be loaned at an annual interest rate that in no case shall be less than the Pennsylvania Industrial Development Authority's rate for the area in which the project is located and for a term that shall be no greater than the term for an equivalent Pennsylvania Industrial Development Authority project. Private companies which receive Sunny Day Fund assistance but fail to make the investment in the enterprise development as specified in section 2 shall be liable for the repayment of all Sunny Day Fund moneys, including any accrued interest thereon and any penalties as provided in the loan documents or as may be set by the Secretary of Commerce. Private companies which receive Sunny Day Fund assistance but fail to create the number of jobs specified in the approved loan or other agreements

with the Commonwealth shall be liable for a penalty equal to an increase in the interest charged to 2% greater than the current prime interest rate for the remainder of the loan, unless the penalty is waived by the Secretary of Commerce because the failure is due to circumstances outside the control of the private company. The prime interest rate shall be the highest rate known or declared to be prime by those banking institutions located within this Commonwealth with assets in excess of \$3,000,000,000 as of the date the penalty is assessed. The Secretary of Commerce shall consult with the chairmen of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives prior to the establishment of waiver of penalties.

Section 4. For a period equal to the term of assistance provided each project approved under this act, the Department of Commerce shall provide a written report on the status of each project to the Secretary of the Senate and the Chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate and to the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives and the Chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives by June 30 of each year. This report shall contain, at a minimum, information pertaining to the specific use of the Sunny Day Fund money, the interest rate and term of the Sunny Day Fund loan, the amount of principal outstanding and interest due on the loan, and the number of jobs created by the project. All recipients of funds under this act shall be required to provide any and all information required by the department of commerce for the purpose of this act.

Section 5. No funds under this act shall be awarded by the Department of Commerce after June 30, 1991. Any funds from this appropriation remaining unexpended or unencumbered on June 30, 1992, shall automatically lapse into the Sunny Day Fund.

Section 6. This act shall take effect immediately.
