## HB 546

Making appropriations from the Tax Stabilization Reserve Fund for the fiscal year 1990-1991.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Pursuant to the provisions of section 205 of the act of July 1, 1985 (P.L.120, No.32), entitled "An act creating a special fund in the Treasury Department for use in attracting major industry into this Commonwealth; establishing a procedure for the appropriation and use of moneys in the fund; establishing the Tax Stabilization Reserve Fund; and providing for expenditures from such account," the sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Tax Stabilization Reserve Fund to the hereinafter named departments of the Executive Department for the fiscal year July 1, 1990, to June 30, 1991, to provide for the continuation of human services programs which are in need of additional funding.

Section 2. The following sum is appropriated to the Department of Education:

For payments to intermediate units on account of special education of exceptional children in public schools.

For medical assistance payments - outpatient services, exclusive of outpatient services provided through capitation plans.

# AN ACT

### HB 1319

Making appropriations from the Professional Licensure Augmentation Account and from restricted revenue accounts within the General Fund to the Department of State for use by the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs in support of the professional licensure boards assigned thereto.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$12,569,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Professional Licensure Augmentation Account within the General Fund to the Department of State for the operation of the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs, including the State Board of Auctioneer Examiners, for the fiscal year July 1, 1991, to June 30, 1992.

Section 2. (a) The sum of \$1,742,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the restricted receipts account of the State Board of Medicine, as authorized by section 907(a) of the act of October 15, 1975 (P.L.390, No.111), known as the Health Care Services Malpractice Act, for the operation of said board for the fiscal year July 1, 1991, to June 30, 1992.

(b) The sum of \$293,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the restricted receipts account of the State Board of Osteopathic Medicine, as authorized by section 907(b) of the Health Care Services Malpractice Act, for the operation of said board for the fiscal year July 1, 1991, to June 30, 1992.

(c) The sum of \$122,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the restricted receipts account of the State Board of Podiatry, as authorized by section 907(c) of the Health Care Services Malpractice Act, for the operation of said board for the fiscal year July 1, 1991, to June 30, 1992.

(d) The sum of \$305,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Athletic Commission Augmentation Account for the State Athletic Commission, as authorized by section 3106 of the act of July 1, 1989 (P.L.136, No.28), known as the Athletic Code, for the support and operation of said commission for the fiscal year July 1, 1991, to June 30, 1992.

(e) Each appropriation listed in subsections (a), (b), (c) and (d) shall not be treated as an augmentation to the Department of State, general government appropriation, or any other appropriation, but shall be treated and accounted for as separate appropriations respectively. Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1991, or immediately, whichever is later.

#### AN ACT

### HB 1322

Making appropriations from the Workmen's Compensation Administration Fund to the Department of Labor and Industry to provide for the expenses of administering The Pennsylvania Workmen's Compensation Act and The Pennsylvania Occupational Disease Act for the fiscal year July 1, 1991, to June 30, 1992, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1991.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$20,839,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Workmen's Compensation Administration Fund to the Department of Labor and Industry for the payment of all salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the administration of the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known as The Pennsylvania Workmen's Compensation Act, and the act of June 21, 1939 (P.L.566, No.284), known as The Pennsylvania Occupational Disease Act, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1991, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1991.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1991, or immediately, whichever is later.
