SB 1440

Appropriating money from the Sunny Day Fund to the Department of Commerce for various projects throughout this Commonwealth for fiscal year 1991-1992.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Sunny Day Fund to the Department of Commerce for the fiscal year July 1, 1991, to June 30, 1992, for the projects listed to enhance economic development and the creation of jobs in this Commonwealth in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 1 of the act of July 1, 1985 (P.L.120, No.32), known as the Sunny Day Fund Act.

Section 2. The following amounts are appropriated to the Department of Commerce to induce companies to locate large industrial, manufacturing or research and development enterprises within this Commonwealth:

(3) For the purpose of making a loan to Plastek Industries, Inc., to establish a manufacturing facility in the City of Erie for new lines of plastic-injected molded products. It is estimated that this project will create 500 new jobs within three years of operation.....

Section 3. It is the intent of the General Assembly that the appropriations in section 2 shall be loaned at an annual interest rate that in no case shall be less than the Pennsylvania Industrial Development Authority's rate for the area in which the project is located and for a term that shall be no greater than the term for an equivalent Pennsylvania Industrial Development Authority project, each as of the date of enactment hereof. Private companies which receive Sunny Day Fund assistance but fail to make the investment in the enterprise development as specified in section 2 shall be liable for the repayment of all Sunny Day Fund moneys, including any accrued interest thereon and any penalties as provided in the loan documents or as may be set by the Secretary of Commerce. Private companies which receive Sunny Day Fund assistance but fail to create the number of jobs specified in the approved loan or other agreements with the Commonwealth shall be liable for a penalty equal to an increase in the interest charged to 2% greater than the current prime interest rate for the remainder of the loan, unless the penalty is waived by the Secretary of Commerce because the failure is due to circumstances outside the control of the private company. The prime interest rate shall be the highest rate known or declared to be prime by those banking institutions located within this Commonwealth with assets in excess of \$3,000,000,000 as of the date the penalty is assessed. The Secretary of Commerce shall consult with the chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives prior to the establishment of waiver of penalties.

Section 4. For a period equal to the term of assistance provided each project approved under this act, the Department of Commerce shall provide a written report on the status of each project to the Secretary of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives by June 30 of each year. This report shall contain, at a minimum, information pertaining to the specific use of the Sunny Day Fund money, the interest rate and term of the Sunny Day Fund loan, the amount of principal outstanding and interest due on the loan and the number of jobs created by the project. All recipients of funds under this act shall be required to provide any and all information required by the Department of Commerce for the purpose of this act.

Section 5. No funds under this act shall be awarded by the Department of Commerce after June 30, 1992. Any funds from this appropriation remaining unexpended or unencumbered on June 30, 1993, shall automatically lapse into the Sunny Day Fund.

Section 6. This act shall take effect immediately.

Section 1. As much of the State appropriation as relates to juvenile probation grants in section 202 of the act of August 4, 1991 (P.L.484, No.7A), known as the General Appropriation Act of 1991, vetoed in part August 4, 1991, is amended to read:

Section 202. Executive Offices.—***

For payments of grants to political subdivisions to assist in the improvement of juvenile probation services. This appropriation includes at least [\$3,900,000] \$2,000,000 for additional intensive probation and aftercare services for reducing lengths of stay and/or placements of juvenile offenders. These funds shall be allocated and disbursed during the 1991-1992 fiscal year.

Given the financial situation of the Commonwealth and the fact that this 1991-92 spending would result in additional 1992-93 spending that I cannot support at this time, I withhold my approval of the last two sentences within this appropriation and approve the line item appropriation in the sum of \$3,483,000 to reflect this veto.

Section 4. As much of the State appropriation as relates to the equalized subsidy for basic education and for court-ordered payments and as much of the Federal appropriations as relate to administration of the Emergency Immigrant Education Assistance and Vocational Education in section 212 of the act are amended and the section is amended by adding an appropriation to read:

Section 212. Department of Education.—***

For payment of the equalized subsidy for basic education to school districts: Provided, That the Secretary of Education, with the approval of the Governor, may make payments from this appropriation in advance of the due date prescribed by law to school districts which are financially handicapped, whenever the Secretary of Education shall deem it necessary to make such advance payments to enable the school districts to keep their public schools open.

This item is approved in the sum of \$2,959,803,000.

I have vetoed \$2 million of the additional \$16 million included in this bill for the Equalized Subsidy for Basic Education (ESBE) appropriation. The \$14 million remaining is the best estimate available of the amount needed to meet payment requirements under the ESBE formula.

Finally, this bill does not include any additional funds for cash grants. The 1992-93 recommended budget presented to you in February contained a supplemental request of \$20.5 million for this appropriation for the remainder of 1991-92. However, my Budget Secretary informed you by letter dated

March 18, 1992, that no additional funds should be provided until the required amount was determined. We continue to monitor caseload and cost projections and will provide a revised estimate of need as soon as it is complete.

Making appropriations from the Workmen's Compensation Administration Fund to the Department of Labor and Industry to provide for the expenses of administering The Pennsylvania Workmen's Compensation Act and The Pennsylvania Occupational Disease Act for the fiscal year July 1, 1992, to June 30, 1993, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1992.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$23,098,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Workmen's Compensation Administration Fund to the Department of Labor and Industry for the payment of all salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the administration of the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known as The Pennsylvania Workmen's Compensation Act, and the act of June 21, 1939 (P.L.566, No.284), known as The Pennsylvania Occupational Disease Act, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1992, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1992.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1992, or immediately, whichever is later.

Making appropriations from the Professional Licensure Augmentation Account and from restricted revenue accounts within the General Fund to the Department of State for use by the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs in support of the professional licensure boards assigned thereto.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$14,127,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Professional Licensure Augmentation Account within the General Fund to the Department of State for the operation of the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs, including the State Board of Auctioneer Examiners, for the fiscal year July 1, 1992, to June 30, 1993.

Section 2. (a) The sum of \$1,806,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the restricted receipts account of the State Board of Medicine, as authorized by section 907(a) of the act of October 15, 1975 (P.L.390, No.111), known as the Health Care Services Malpractice Act, for the operation of said board for the fiscal year July 1, 1992, to June 30, 1993.

(b) The sum of \$308,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the restricted receipts account of the State Board of Osteopathic Medicine, as authorized by section 907(b) of the Health Care Services Malpractice Act, for the operation of said board for the fiscal year July 1, 1992, to June 30, 1993.

(c) The sum of \$124,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the restricted receipts account of the State Board of Podiatry, as authorized by section 907(c) of the Health Care Services Malpractice Act, for the operation of said board for the fiscal year July 1, 1992, to June 30, 1993.

(d) The sum of \$237,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Athletic Commission Augmentation Account for the State Athletic Commission, as authorized by section 3106 of the act of July 1, 1989 (P.L.136, No.28), known as the Athletic Code, for the support and operation of said commission for the fiscal year July 1, 1992, to June 30, 1993.

(e) Each appropriation listed in subsections (a), (b), (c) and (d) shall not be treated as an augmentation to the Department of State, general government appropriation or any other appropriation, but shall be treated and accounted for as separate appropriations respectively. 1856 Act 1992-5A

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1992, or immediately, whichever is later.

Making an appropriation from the Public School Employees' Retirement Fund to provide for expenses of the Public School Employees' Retirement Board for the fiscal year July 1, 1992, to June 30, 1993, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1992.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$18,282,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Public School Employees' Retirement Fund to the Public School Employees' Retirement Board for the payment of all salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses of the employees and members of the Public School Employees' Retirement Board, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities of the board for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1992, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1992.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1992, or immediately, whichever is later.

APPROVED—The 18th day of June, A. D. 1992.
