## A SUPPLEMENT

## SB 1098

To the act of June 28, 1993 (P.L.134, No.31), entitled "An act providing for the capital budget for the fiscal year 1993-1994," itemizing public improvement projects, furniture and equipment projects, transportation assistance projects, flood control projects and redevelopment assistance projects to be constructed or acquired or assisted by the Department of General Services, the Department of Environmental Resources, the Department of Community Affairs or the Department of Transportation, together with their estimated financial costs; authorizing the incurring of debt without the approval of the electors for the purpose of financing the projects to be constructed or acquired or assisted by the Department of General Services, the Department of Environmental Resources, the Department of Community Affairs or the Department of Transportation; stating the estimated useful life of the projects; authorizing certain waivers; making appropriations; and making repeals.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

## Section 1. Short title.

This act shall be known and may be cited as the Capital Budget Project Itemization Act for 1993-1994.

Section 2. Total authorizations.

- (a) Public improvements.—The total authorization for the additional capital projects in the category of public improvement projects itemized in section 3 and to be acquired or constructed by the Department of General Services, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt shall be \$1,319,669,000.
- (b) Furniture and equipment.—The total authorization for the additional capital projects in the category of public improvement projects consisting of the acquisition of original movable furniture and equipment to complete public improvement projects itemized in section 4 and to be acquired by the Department of General Services, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt shall be \$31,070,000.
- (c) Transportation assistance.—The total authorization for the capital projects in the category of transportation assistance projects itemized in section 5 with respect to which an interest is to be acquired in or constructed by the Department of Transportation, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt shall be \$296,344,000.
- (d) Flood control.—The total authorization for the capital projects in the category of flood control projects itemized in section 6 and to be constructed by the Department of Environmental Resources, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt shall be \$82,850,000.
- (e) Redevelopment assistance.—The total authorization for the additional capital projects in the category of redevelopment assistance projects itemized

in section 7 for capital grants by the Department of Community Affairs, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt shall be \$485,173,000.

Section 3. Itemization of public improvement projects.

Additional capital projects in the category of public improvement projects to be constructed or acquired by the Department of General Services, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt are hereby itemized, together with their respective estimated financial costs, as follows:

Section 8. Limited waiver of local requirements.	

- (a) Waiver for 1993-1994 itemization.—The limitation on Department of Transportation funding of capital projects under 74 Pa.C.S. § 1302(4) (relating to program authorizations) shall be totally waived for the capital projects in the category of transportation assistance projects for mass transit contained in section 5(a)(20)(iv) and (21)(vii) and those portions of section 5(a)(26) and (27) which are vehicle safety and overhaul.
  - (b) Waiver for 1992 itemization.—
  - (1) Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, there shall be no local match funding requirement for the national magnetic levitation prototype proposal and development phase, as described in section 5(b)(15)(I)(A) of the act of December 28, 1992 (P.L.1694, No.188), known as the Capital Budget Project Itemization Act of 1991-1992.
  - (2) The Department of Transportation shall select a contractor for the project described in section 5(b)(15)(I)(A) of the Capital Budget Project Itemization Act of 1991-1992. Such selection shall be based on the following criteria: the contractor must have extensive knowledge of magnetic levitation technology and have been incorporated in this Commonwealth for at least two years for the express purpose of developing magnetic levitation technology. The contractor must also have demonstrated an ability to attract private sector investment, including corporate and labor participation, as well as Federal, State and local funding for magnetic levitation development.

Section 9. Delegation of public improvement projects.

For the public improvement projects specifically itemized in section 3(9)(ii) of this act, the Department of General Services may delegate the authority to construct, improve, equip, furnish, maintain, acquire or operate those projects to the Philadelphia Regional Port Authority.

Section 10. Use of existing funds.

The sum of \$8,779,000, which is the amount authorized for the purchase of furniture and equipment for the projects which are included in section 4, shall be provided from excess funds available in the unallocated reserve of the Capital Facilities Fund from previous furniture and equipment

appropriations.

Section 11. Debt authorization.

- (a) Public improvements.—The Governor, the Auditor General and the State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow, from time to time, in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$1,319,669,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the acquisition and construction of the public improvement projects specifically itemized in a capital budget.
- (b) Furniture and equipment.—The Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow, from time to time, in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$22,291,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the public improvement projects consisting of the acquisition of original movable furniture and equipment specifically itemized in a capital budget.
- (c) Transportation assistance.—The Governor, the Auditor General and the State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow, from time to time, in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$296,344,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the acquisition and construction of the transportation assistance projects specifically itemized in a capital budget.
- (d) Flood control.—The Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow, from time to time, in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$82,850,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the construction of the flood control projects specifically itemized in a capital budget.
- (e) Redevelopment assistance.—Subject to the limitation in section 1616.1-B(b) of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known as The Fiscal Code, the Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow, from time to time, in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$485,173,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the redevelopment assistance projects specifically itemized in a capital budget.

Section 12. Issue of bonds.

The indebtedness authorized in this act shall be incurred, from time to time, and shall be evidenced by one or more series of general obligation SESSION OF 1993 Act 1993-47 311

bonds of the Commonwealth in such aggregate principal amount for each series as the Governor, the Auditor General and the State Treasurer shall determine, but the latest stated maturity date shall not exceed the estimated useful life of the projects being financed as stated in section 13.

Section 13. Estimated useful life and term of debt.

- (a) Estimated useful life.—The General Assembly states that the estimated useful life of the public improvement projects itemized in this act is as follows:
  - (1) Public improvement projects, 30 years.
  - (2) Furniture and equipment projects, 10 years.
  - (3) Transportation assistance projects:
    - (i) Rolling stock, 15 years.
    - (ii) Passenger buses, 12 years.
    - (iii) Furniture and equipment, 10 years.
    - (iv) All others, 30 years.
- (b) Term of debt.—The maximum term of the debt authorized to be incurred under this act is 30 years.

Section 14. Appropriations.

- (a) Public improvements.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of General Services in the maximum amount of \$1,319,669,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the public improvement projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of General Services the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.
- (b) Furniture and equipment.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of General Services in the maximum amount of \$22,291,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the public improvement projects consisting of the acquisition of original movable furniture and equipment specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of General Services the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.
- (c) Transportation assistance.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of Transportation in the maximum amount of \$296,344,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the transportation assistance projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expense of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of Transportation the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.
- (d) Flood control.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund

to the Department of Environmental Resources in the maximum amount of \$82,850,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the flood control projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of Environmental Resources the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

(e) Redevelopment assistance.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of Community Affairs in the maximum amount of \$485,173,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the redevelopment assistance projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of Community Affairs the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable. Section 15. Federal funds.

In addition to those funds appropriated in section 14, all moneys received from the Federal Government for the projects specifically itemized in this act are also hereby appropriated for those projects.

Section 16. Repeals.

Sections 3(8)(vi)(C) and (D), (xxiii)(B) and 6(20)(iii)(A) of the act of October 21, 1988 (P.L.851, No.113), known as the Capital Budget Project Itemization Act for 1987-1988, are repealed.

Section 42(a)(3) of the act of December 14, 1992 (P.L.894, No.143), known as the Highway-Railroad and Highway Bridge Capital Budget Supplemental Act for 1991-1992, is repealed.

Section 17. Editorial changes.

In editing and preparing this act for printing following the final enactment, the Legislative Reference Bureau shall insert or revise letters or numbers for projects where the letters or numbers are missing or require revision. The bureau shall also revise the total monetary amounts for the total authorization, debt authorization, appropriations and departmental totals as necessary to agree with the total monetary amounts of the projects.

Section 18. Effective date.

This act shall take effect immediately.

APPROVED—The 2nd day of July, A.D. 1993, except as to the following: Section 14. Appropriations.

(a) Public improvements.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of General Services in the maximum amount of \$1,319,669,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the public improvement projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of General Services the moneys as

required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

This item is approved in the sum of \$297,386,000.

(b) Furniture and equipment.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of General Services in the maximum amount of \$22,291,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the public improvement projects consisting of the acquisition of original movable furniture and equipment specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of General Services the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

This item is approved in the sum of \$2,419,000.

(c) Transportation assistance.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of Transportation in the maximum amount of \$296,344,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the transportation assistance projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expense of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of Transportation the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

This item is approved in the sum of \$173,251,000.

(d) Flood control.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of Environmental Resources in the maximum amount of \$82,850,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the flood control projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of Environmental Resources the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

This item is approved in the sum of \$3,500,000.

(e) Redevelopment assistance.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of Community Affairs in the maximum amount of \$485,173,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the redevelopment assistance projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of Community Affairs the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

This item is approved in the sum of \$177,488,000.

As in previous capital project itemization bills received by this

Administration, parts of the above appropriations have been deleted because some projects included in this bill are not legal or are duplicates of projects approved in previous capital project authorization acts. In addition, significant reductions have been made for projects which were not included in an agency five-year capital plan. Those projects would not have received or passed an agency review as to need or legality. These reductions are necessary because the total contained in this bill, added to the projects remaining from prior capital project authorization acts which are still pending implementation, is beyond the financial capability of the Commonwealth to undertake.

The aggregate capital debt authorized but not issued now stands at over \$14.4 billion for all categories of projects. The aggregate capital debt authorized but not issued for public improvement projects accounts for over \$2.9 billion of the total Senate Bill 1098 without reduction would have increased this amount by over \$1.3 billion, to a total of over \$4.2 billion for public improvement projects alone. This Administration remains committed to maintaining our financial integrity through exercising restraint in the amount of new construction and other capital projects undertaken, and approving the substantial increase which Senate Bill 1098 contained without disapproval could have a negative impact on our bond rating which would result in higher costs to issue those bonds needed to insure the continued operation of the Commonwealth and its programs, including the capital program.

Substantial capital project itemization acts have been passed in 1986, 1988, 1990, 1992 and now 1993. It is beyond reasonable expectations that all projects approved in those acts could be started and still maintain our financial integrity. Therefore, consideration was given to approving projects which are most likely to be undertaken.

Some recurring problems with recent capital project itemization acts should be noted here. The first is the number of projects which cannot be undertaken by the Commonwealth which are included in the acts. Some of these projects are in the wrong category, such as community college projects in the public improvement projects and furniture and equipment categories which are reserved exclusively for Commonwealth-owned facilities. Community college projects, like the Montgomery Community College projects, are not funded through the capital budget process but receive funding for the State share of capital costs from the annual General Fund appropriation to community colleges. Other projects contained in the bill do not meet additional requirements of the category of project, such as sewer, water and housing projects are not eligible for funding under the redevelopment assistance category or are below the minimum required for bond funding.

A second problem is the number of duplicates contained in the bill. Some projects are placed in more than one category and other projects, like the Nescopek State Park project in public improvement and the Wyoming Valley

flood control project in flood control, are already approved in prior acts.

Finally, projects which were vetoed in previous acts because they were not included in an agency five-year plan are again appearing in this bill and must again be vetoed for the same reason. Such projects have not received the needed review and inclusion in an agency plan which allows us to prioritize projects and move them in an orderly way through the capital process. This is especially true for the higher education institutions whose voluminous projects are again vetoed for lack of review. The higher education institutions need to work more closely with the Department of Education to assure that those projects which the institutions view as needed can pass department review and be included in the five-year plan so that in future years these projects could be approved.

Some of the projects vetoed from Senate Bill 1098 could be funded from the Keystone Recreation, Park and Conservation Fund which is in House Bill 52, also on the Governor's desk for approval. If approved by the electorate, \$50 million in bond funds will be available for both State and local parks and cultural facilities in addition to other uses. The Fund will also receive 15% of the Realty Transfer Tax collected by the Commonwealth beginning in 1994-95. This will be an estimated \$30 million annually for the purposes of the Fund.

As in previous item vetoes of capital project authorization acts, those projects which will not be undertaken are listed below.
