Be It Enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That no person whatsoever shall Cut, fell alter or Remove any known marcked or any Certain bounded tree, or other allowed Land mark, To the wrong of his neighbour or any other person, under the penalty of any Sum not exceeding ten pounds.

CHAPTER 76.

[76] THE LAW ABOUT DEBTS PAYABLE IN COUNTRY PRODUCE.

Be It Enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That all persons within this Province or Territories Contracting debts to be paid in fresh pork tobacco or Corn, at any particular debtors plantation that shall not be demanded by the Creditor or his Assigns in their proper Seasons, As from the Last of the eighth Moneth to the tenth of the second Moneth, Then it shall be Lawful for the debtor to dispose of the said pork, tobacco or Corn, and shall not be obliged to Comply with the Same, Untill the next eighth Moneth ensuing.
