

thereof any person So Suppressed Shall presume to Keep any Ordinary or Drinking House again Such Person after Conviction thereof in open Court Shall forfeit Ten Pounds to be put into the County Stock where Such offence is Committed to be Appropriated towards the Defraying the Publick Charge of the County Except the Said Person So offending be Again recommended as Above And his or her Lycence Thereupon Renewed, And If Such Person or Persons So offending and do or Shall forfeit as Aforesaid shall refuse to Pay the Same then it shall be Lawfull for any Two Justices of the Peace to Issue forth their Warrant Directed to the Sherif of the County or his Deputy to Leavy the Same by Distress And Sale of his or her Goods Returning the Overplus to the Owner if Any be And where Noe Effects to distrain on, are to be found to satisfye, In such Case the Said Person so offending Shall be Committed to the County Goale, or house of Correction there to Remain two Months And to be Kept At hard Labour to the use of the County and that the Justices Shall Cause his or her Sign to be Immediately Pulld Down for Every offence after the said fine of ten Pounds or two months Imprisoning as aforesaid-This act to Continue Dureing the Proprietors Pleasure And no Longer

CHAPTER 148.

THE LAW FOR APOINTING AN OFFICER TO RECTIFIE & STAMP ALL MONY WEIGHTS.

Whereas there is a Generall Complaint among the Inhabitants of this Province and Territories for want of a Standerd for the money Weights Be it Enacted by the Authority Aforesaid That no Person within this Government from and after the 24 Day of the 7 Month next Shall be Oblidged to Receive or Take any money by any Weights which are not made of Brass Regulated and Stampd by the Person that now is or Shall be hereafter appoynted for that Purpose Which said Officer shall keepe in his Possession at all Times a True Standerd of Brass

Troy Weights According to the Kings Standerd of England by which he Shall Truly and Exactly Regulate all Persons Weights that shall be brought to him and Stamp the Same with his Stamp; for the Doeing of which he Shall have one peny for every weight So Stampd and Rectified which Said Officer Shall have power once in 3 Years To Call any Persons weights to a New Tryall and Stamp if Occasion be And for the more Speedy Putting this Law In Execution It shall and may be Lawfull for Thomas Paschall Senior of Philadelphia to Execute the Same as Long as the Governor & Council shall see meet And in Case of Death or other Occasions The Governor and Council shall have power to Nominate and Appoynt any other person in his Room And whereas Differance hath Arisen about the Goodness and Exactness of Scales It Shall be Lawfull for the Receiver of Money to Choose which end of the Beame they will have the money weighed on If the Payer be owner of the Scales And if the Money Turn the Scale It shall be Accounted Passable

CHAPTER 149.

THE LAW TO PREVENT THE RUNNING OF STONE HORSES ATT LARGE.

Bee It Enacted by the Authority aforesaid That No Person within this Government shall from and After the first day of The Second Month next Ensueing Suffer any Stone horse to Run att large after two Years Old under Thirteen hands high, four inches to the hand, upon forfeiting the Sum of Twenty Shillings for every Such horse so running att large, which Shall be by the owner of every Such horse paid to any freeholder, housekeeper Or Ranger of the County within this Governement who Shall take up and bring in any Such horse in the Second and Third Months, But where The Owner of the said horse Cannot be found or known in one Weeks time next after his or being taken up Then to be Delivered unto the Ranger of the County who Shall Cause the Said Horse to bee gelded and Published, by fixing his Artificiall Marks in
