to the use of the said hospital, together with a list of such donations, shall be fairly drawn out and published annually in the Gazette or other newspapers; and the managers of the said hospital shall at all times when required submit the books, accounts, affairs and economy thereof to the inspection and free examination of such visitors as may from time to time be appointed by the assembly of this province to visit and inspect the same.

[Section IV.] Provided always, and it is hereby further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That if at any time hereafter there should not be a constant succession of contributors to meet yearly and choose managers as aforesaid then the said hospital and the estate and affairs thereof shall be in the management and under the direction of such persons as shall be from time to time appointed by act of general assembly of this province for that purpose.

CHAPTER CCCXCI.

AN ACT FOR REPEALING AN ACT, ENTITLED "A SUPPLEMENT TO THE ACT, ENTITLED 'AN ACT FOR IMPOSING A DUTY ON PERSONS CONVICTED OF HEINOUS CRIMES AND TO PREVENT POOR AND IMPOTENT PERSONS BEING IMPORTED INTO THIS PROVINCE." "1

[Section I.] Be it enacted by the Honorable James Hamilton, Esquire, Lieutenant-Governor under the Honorable Thomas Penn and Richard Penn, Esquires, true and absolute Proprietaries of the Province of Pennsylvania and the counties of Newcastle, Kent and Sussex upon Delaware, by and with the advice and consent of the representatives of the freemen of the said Province in General Assembly met, and by the authority of the

same, That an act of the general assembly of this province passed in the twenty-third year of the reign of the present King, entitled "A supplement to the act, entitled 'An act for imposing a duty on persons convicted of heinous crimes, and to prevent poor and impotent persons being imported into this province,'" and every clause, matter and thing therein contained shall be and [is] hereby repealed, utterly made null and void.
