[Section IV.] (Section IV, P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said commissioners, previously to selling any tickets in the said lottery, shall lay the scheme thereof before the governor of this commonwealth, to be approved by him, and shall also enter into bonds to the governor for the due and faithful performance of their duty in the drawing of said lottery.

[Section V.] (Section V, P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That all prizes, not demanded within twelve months after publication as aforesaid, shall be considered as relinquished for the benefit of the undertaking.

CHAPTER MMLI.

AN ACT FOR PERPETUATING THE PENAL LAWS OF THIS STATE.

[Section I.] (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That so much of the act, entitled, "An act to reform the penal laws of this state," passed the fifth day of April, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-five,² together tined by the act, entitled, "An act to continue in force the act, entitled, 'An act to reform the penal laws of this state,' and for other purposes therein mentioned," passed the eighteenth day of April, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-five, "together with the last recited act, excepting only so much thereof as limits the continuance of the said recited acts, be, and the same hereby are made perpetual.
