CHAPTER MMCXVIII.

AN ACT TO GRANT RESTITUTION TO JOHN BOGGS, JAMES BOGGS AND WILLIAM ATKINS, FOR LOST CERTIFICATES.

Whereas it appears that certificates of funded debt were issued for militia pay, bearing an interest from the first of July, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-three, viz: Number five thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, for one pound eighteen shillings and six pence, in favor of James Boggs; number five thousand eight hundred and thirteen, for one pound one shilling, in favor of John Boggs; and number five thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, for nine pounds, in favor of William Atkins; on all of which two years' interest hath been paid, and which, by the existing laws of the state, interest is payable only to the first day of August, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-two; and that the said certificates remain outstanding and unsatisfied. Therefore:

[Section I.] (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the governor be, and he is hereby, authorized to draw his warrant upon the state treasurer, in favor of James Boggs, for the sum of one pound eighteen shillings and six pence; and his warrant, for one pound one shilling, in favor of John Boggs; and likewise his warrant in favor of William Atkins, for the sum of nine pounds; together with lawful interest on the above said three sums, from the first day of July, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-five, until the first day of August, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-two.
