CHAPTER MMCLXXXIII.

AN ACT VESTING A MOIETY OF ONE OF THE CITY LOTS THEREIN MENTIONED IN THE MINISTER, TRUSTEES, ELDERS AND DEACONS OF THE GERMAN REFORMED CONGREGATION IN THE CITY OF PHILADELPHIA.

Whereas the minister, trustees, elders and deacons of the German reformed congregation in the city of Philadelphia, in the province of Pennsylvania, have prayed that a lot of ground belonging to the commonwealth may be granted to them for the purpose of a burial place, and the site of a charity school. And whereas views so pious and meritorious ought to be promoted by the legislature. Therefore:

[Section I.] (Section I. P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same. That all the right, title and interest of this commonwealth to the eastern moiety of a square of ground, bounded on the south by Mulberry street, on the east by the Sixth street from Schuylkill, on the north by Cherry street, and on the west by the Fifth street from Schuylkill, containing east and west three hundred and ninety-six feet, and in length or depth north and south two hundred and eightyeight feet, shall be, and hereby is vested in the minister, trustees, elders and deacons of the German reformed congregation in the city of Philadelphia, in the province of Pennsylvania, and their successors forever, to and for the purposes of a burial place and the site of a charity school, and for no other use, intent or purpose whatsoever.
