county of Huntingdon, and the same shall be approved of by the court of quarter sessions of the peace and grand jury of the said county, the same shall be kept up, maintained and repaired as other roads, highways and bridges are maintained, kept up and repaired.

CHAPTER MMCXCI.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE OF THE STONE BRIDGE ERECTED BY CHRISTIAN BINKLEY ACROSS THE RIVER CONESTOGA FOR PUBLIC USE.

Whereas Christian Binkley, on his private resources, has erected a stone bridge of ten arches across the river Conestoga, which in its design and execution, combines permanency and accommodation, with extensive public utility. Therefore:

[Section I.] (Section I,) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the commissioners of the county of Lancaster be, and they are hereby, authorized to pay unto Christian Binkley, the sum of four thousand two hundred and sixty-six dollars and sixty-seven cents, which sum has been awarded by the court of general quarter sessions and grand jury of the county of Lancaster, to the said Christian Binkley, towards compensating him for erecting a stone bridge over the river Conestoga, in the county of Lancaster. Provided, That said Christian Binkley doth convey the said bridge for public use, in the manner heretofore proposed by him.
