## CHAPTER MMCXCV.

AN ACT DIRECTING THE PLACE OF HOLDING THE ELECTIONS IN LONDONDERRY TOWNSHIP, IN THE COUNTY OF BEDFORD.

[Section I.] (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That, from and after the passing of this act, the electors of Londonderry township, in the county of Bedford, shall hold their elections at the house now occupied by Andrew Shearer, within said township, any former law to the contrary thereof notwithstanding.

## CHAPTER MMCXCVI.

## AN ACT TO EMPOWER THE GOVERNOR TO NEGOTIATE A LOAN FOR FOR THE USE OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

[Section I.] (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the governor be, and he is hereby, authorized, during the recess of the legislature, to negotiate a loan, on the faith and for the use of the state, with the Bank of Pennsylvania, or either of the other banks established in the city of Philadelphia, for a sum of money not exceeding twenty thousand dollars: Provided the exigencies of the state should render such a loan necessary. And provided also, That the rate of interest to be allowed an the sum borrowed shall not exceed six per centum per annum.
