to the several acts relative to the establishing town and out lots, and selling the same, within the reserved tracts of land adjoining Erie, Franklin, Warren and Waterford," passed the nineteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred,¹ shall be, and the same act, except the limitation thereof, is hereby extended and further continued in force, for and during the term of one year, from and after the passing of this act.

CHAPTER MMCCI.

AN ACT TO COMPENSATE JAMES PEARSON.

Whereas James Pearson, by the order and under the direction of the committee of the house of representatives of this commonwealth, in the years one thousand seven hundred and ninety-six, and one thousand seven hundred and ninety-seven, and one thousad seven hundred and ninety-eight, made sundry draughts, plans, and books of reference, of the city and barrack lots, the property of this commonwealth, for which he hath not been fully compensated. Therefore:

[Section I.] (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the comptroller general and register general be, and they are hereby, authorized to adjust and settle the accounts of James Pearson, for the services aforesaid; and the governor is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the state treasurer, in favor of said James Pearson, for the amount of the sum so adjusted and settled, to be paid out of any unappropriated moneys of this state.
