CHAPTER MMCCXIII.

AN ACT ERECTING TWO ELECTION DISTRICTS IN THE COUNTY OF MERCER, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

[Section I.] (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That, from and after the passing of this act, the township of Salem, in the county of Mercer, be, and the same is hereby, erected into a separate election district, to be called the seventh district; and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at John Williamson's mill, in said township.

[Section II.] (Section II, P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That so much of the county of Mercer, lying west of the donation land, to the state line, be, and the same is hereby, erected into a separate election district; and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the dwelling house now occupied by Benjamin Bently, in said district, and to be called the eighth district.

[Section III.] (Section III, P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That those citizens of Mercer county, who have heretofore held their elections at the house of John Elliot, and which may not be included in the district in which the citizens are authorized to hold their elections at the house now occupied by Bejamin Bently, shall be, and hereby are, annexed to the district which held their elections at the house now occupied by Benjamin Stokely; and that the inhabitants of Beaver county, who have heretofore held their elections at the house of John Elliot, shall heretofore be annexed to the district which holds their elections at the town of Beaver.
