## 1802] The Statutes at Large of Pennsylvania.

Section I. (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the governor be, and he is hereby authorized to draw his warrant upon the state treasurer, in favor of Peter Williams, for the sum of eighty-eight pounds one shilling and nine pence, together with lawful interest on the said sum from the first day of July, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-four, until the first day of August, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-two.

## CHAPTER MMCCXXIX.

AN ACT FURTHER TO ENCOURAGE THE KILLING OF WOLVES.

(Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate Section I. and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this act, any person or persons who shall kill any wolf or wolves within the bounds of any county within this commonwealth, and who shall produce the head or heads thereof before any justice of the peace in and for any county as aforesaid, it shall be the duty of such justice to examine such person or persons, on oath or affirmation, touching the time when, and place where such wolf or wolves was or were caught and killed; and if the place of such catching and killing shall be found to be within the bounds of the county in which such justice has jurisdiction, and if the wolf be full grown, it then shall be the duty of such justice, after destroying such head or heads, to give such person or persons a certificate thereof, and to sign an order for eight dollars, on the treasurer of the county in which it shall have appeared such wolf or wolves was or were caught and killed, for each and every head produced as beforementioned; and for every wolf-puppy that shall be produced and destroyed as before mentioned, he shall sign an order on the treasurer aforesaid for the sum of two dollars and fifty cents: and it shall be the duty of such treasurer, and he is hereby directed to pay the amount of the said order, out of the money in the treasury appropriated for county purposes.

Section II. (Section II, P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That so much of the act entitled "An act more effectually to encourage the killing of wolves," passed the thirteenth of April, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-two,<sup>1</sup> as is hereby altered or amended, is hereby repealed.

Section III. (Section III, P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That this act shall be and continue in force for three years, and from thence to the end of the next session of the general assembly.

## CHAPTER MMCCXXX.

## AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE SALE OF THE ESTATE OF CATHARINE ERRINGER, A LUNATIC, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES THEREIN MENTIONED.

Whereas, it appears by an inquisition taken at the almshouse, in the county of Philadelphia, on the twenty-first day of September, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-five, by virtue of a commission of lunacy, under the seal of the court of common pleas, for the said county, that Catharine Erringer was, at the time of taking said inquisition, a lunatic: And whereas, it has been represented to the legislature, by the petition of Frederick Erringer, of the city of Philadelphia, and of the guardians of the poor in the said city, that the said Catharine Erringer, sister of the said Frederick, for several years last past, hath been, and still is, a charge to the said city and liberties; and that she is seized in fee, of one undivided sixth part of a certain three story brick house, and lot or piece of ground thereto belonging, situate on the east side of Delaware Third street, continued a little to the north-
