CHAPTER MMDXL.

AN ACT TO ERECT BUFFALO TOWNSHIP, IN THE COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND, INTO A SEPARATE ELECTION DISTRICT.

Section I. (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this act, the township of Buffalo, in Cumberland county, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house now occupied by William Thomson, in Buffalo township aforesaid; any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

CHAPTER MMDXLI.

AN ACT EXTENDING THE ACT, ENTITLED "AN ACT FOR THE RELIEF OF DIVERS INHABITANTS OF THE COUNTY OF ADAMS." (4).

Section I. (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the provisions of the act, entitled, "An act for the relief of divers inhabitants of the county of Adams," passed the twelfth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and two, (1) be and the same is hereby extended and to continue in force, until the first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seven.
