Section I. (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the officers of the land office, are hereby authorized and required to issue a warrant, and complete a title to Sebastian Royer and Michael Myer, in trust for the congregation of Beaver and Centre townships, in the county of Northumberland, for ten acres of land in said Centre township, adjoining lands of Sebastian Royer, Michael Myer and Abraham Haffinger, on receiving the purchase money and fees agreeably to law.

CHAPTER MMDCXXX.

AN ACT GRANTING A SUM OF MONEY TO THE TRUSTEES OF BELLE-FONTE ACADEMY, IN CENTRE COUNTY.

Section I. (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the governor be authorized to draw his warrant, on the state treasurer, for the sum of two thousand dollars, which is hereby granted out of any money not heretofore specially appropriated, which may be in the treasury of this commonwealth, to the trustees of Bellefonte academy, to be applied in erecting a suitable building for the accommodation of the said institution.

Section II. (Section II, P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That there shall be admitted into said academy any number of poor children, who may at any time be offered, in order to be taught gratis: Provided, the number so admitted and taught shall at no time be greater than six, and that none of the said children shall continue to be taught gratis, in said academy longer than two years.
