CHAPTER MMDCCLXXXIII.

AN ACT FOR THE RELIEF OF JAMES SMITH.

Whereas it has been represented that James Smith of Lycoming county, a private soldier in captain James Murry's company of the flying camp, was taken prisoner at fort Washington the sixteenth of November, one thousand seven hundred and seventy-six, and remained in confinement until March following, when he was liberated; owing to sickness and debility, did not reach his home until one month after; and that he has never received any pay or compensation for his services and suffering during the aforesaid term: Therefore,

Section I. (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the treasurer of this commonwealth, be, and he is hereby directed to pay to James Smith of Lycoming county, or his legal attorney, the sum of one hundred dollars, on a warrant drawn by the governor in the usual manner, as a consideration in full for his services and sufferings whilst a prisoner, in the late revolutionary war with Great Britain.

CHAPTER MMDCCLXXXIV.

AN ACT GRANTING TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS TO THE COMMISSIONERS OF ERIE COUNTY FOR THE PURPOSE OF ERECTING PUBLIC BUILDINGS FOR THE USE OF SAID COUNTY.
