

CHAPTER MMCMXXIV.

AN ACT TO RAISE BY WAY OF LOTTERY, A SUM OF MONEY, TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSES INCURRED BY THE TRUSTEES OF THE GERMAN PRESBYTERIAN, AND GERMAN LUTHERAN CONGREGATIONS, IN THE BOROUGH OF CARLISLE AND ITS VICINITY, IN THE COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND.

Section I. (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Jacob Hendel, Joseph Shrom, Jacob Weaver, Jacob Matter, Philip Reisinger and Peter Fishburn, of the county of Cumberland, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners to raise by way of lottery a sum of money not exceeding nine thousand dollars, to be by them equally divided and applied to the payment of the debts and completing their respective churches: (to wit) the German Presbyterian and German Lutheran churches, in the borough of Carlisle, in the county of Cumberland.

Section II. (Section II, P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said commissioners, before they proceed to sell any tickets in the lottery aforesaid, shall lay such scheme thereof before the Governor as shall meet his approbation, and enter into bonds to him for the due performance of their duty in selling the tickets, drawing the lottery and paying the prizes; and each of them before entering on the duties of his appointment, shall take and subscribe an oath or affirmation, diligently and faithfully to perform the duties hereby entrusted to him; and three or more of the said commissioners shall attend at the drawing of each day, and when the whole is completed, shall cause an accurate list of the fortunate numbers to be published in one of the English and German papers printed in the borough of Carlisle; and shall pay and discharge the prizes that shall be demanded, by persons legally entitled thereto, within forty days after the drawing shall be completed.

Section III. (Section III, P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said commissioners, be, and they are hereby authorized to settle and adjust all the accounts which may be exhibited by any person or persons legally employed in carrying this act into effect; and that all expenses attending the same, except compensation to the commissioners, who shall perform their services gratis, shall be paid by the said commissioners, out of the proceeds of said lottery.

Section IV. (Section IV, P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That all prizes not demanded within twelve months next after publication as aforesaid, shall be considered and deemed as relinquished for the benefit of the aforesaid congregations.

CHAPTER MMCMXXV.

AN ACT TO CHANGE THE NAME OF CHRISTIAN FEBIGER CARSON, TO CHRISTIAN CARSON FEBIGER.

Whereas it has been represented by Christian Carson Febiger, of the city of Philadelphia, that in compliance with the directions contained in the last will and testament of his uncle the late colonel Christian Febiger, by whom he was adopted, he has changed his name as aforesaid, and he has prayed the legislature to sanction and confirm the said change of name: Therefore,

Section I. (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the said Christian Carson Febiger, formerly Christian Febiger Carson, shall henceforth be called and known by the name of Christian Carson Febiger,
