#### CHAPTER MMMI.

AN ACT TO PROHIBIT THE SALE OF LANDS FOR TAXES UPON WHICH THE STATE HAS A LIEN.

Section I. (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That it shall not be lawful for the commissioners of any county within this commonwealth, to sell for taxes, within two years from the passing of this act, any land late the property of John Nicholson, purchased in for the use of the commonwealth, or lands of Peter Baynton, upon which the state has a lien; a list of which shall be furnished to the commissioners of the respective counties where such lands lie, by the secretary of the commonwealth.

#### CHAPTER MMMII.

AN ACT FOR THE RELIEF OF EDWARD CAVANOUGH.

Whereas it hath been represented to the legislature, that Edward Cavanough enlisted in captain Matthew Smith's company of riflemen, for one year, and marched to Boston in the year one thousand seven hundred and seventy-five, and from thence to Quebec, and after that severe tour of duty, he 899

continued in the first regiment commanded by colonel Edward Hand, for two years, at the expiration of which time he was discharged on account of his ill state of health, and being much afflicted with rheumatic pains, owing to old age and hard service he is not able to obtain subsistence by manual labor: Therefore,

Section I. (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same. That the sum of forty dollars be, and the same is hereby granted to Edward Cavanough, to be paid to him or his lawful attorney, immediately after the passing of this act, on a warrant drawn by the governor on the state treasurer, and that an annuity of forty dollars be granted for the use of the said Edward Cavanough, to be paid to Thomas Campbell, his executor or executors, administrator or administrators, or his or their lawful attorney, which annuity shall be expended by the said Thomas Campbell, his executor or executors, administrator or administrators, his or their lawful attorney, in providing clothing and diet for the said Edward Cavanough, and it shall be the duty of the said Thomas Campbell, his executor or executors, administrator or administrators, his or their lawful attorney, to make an annual return to the orphans' court of York county, on oath or affirmation, how and in what manner he or they have executed the trust in him or them confided by this act.<sup>(1)</sup>

A SUPPLEMENT TO AN ACT, ENTITLED "AN ACT FOR RAISING BY WAY OF LOTTERY, THE SUM OF SIX THOUSAND DOLLARS, FOR DEFRAY-ING THE EXPENSES OF MAKING AN AQUEDUCT TO CONDUCT WATER INTO THE TOWN OF MEADVILLE." (<sup>1</sup>).
